


mindThe speaker discussed the concept, characteristics and philosophy of the IPRs. The speaker also pointed out about the rights granted to a person or business over the creations of their minds and how it spurs economic growth via technological changes. According to the speaker, the issues involved in analysing the role of intellectual property rights in promoting economic development and growth are extremely complex.

Sir spoke about the latter influenced by IPRs that was first granted in 1474 in Italy. He also mentioned that the modern era began with the Paris convention(1883) and Berne convention(1886), WIPO 1970, Which became a UN body in 1974. Sir also discussed TRIPs agreement 1994, the three distinct philosophies i.e, Natural rights view, Public rights view, Modern or Utilitarian view.


Sir also discussed IPRs in open economy, that things are more complicated, developing countries have resistance from it and IPRs are used as instruments of trade policy. He explained that non rivalrous and non excludable are the two characteristics of modern rationale for IPRs. He also drew attention towards the weak and strong IPRs and instruments of IP protection i.e, Patents, copyrights, trademarks, geographical indications, plant breeders' rights (PBRs). After his discussion, Professor Sunil Kanwar answered all queries that were raised by participants making the session extremely interactive and fruitful for the participants.

Dr. Shilpa Chaudhary, the TIC of the department, thanked the speaker for a very enriching and informative session. The seminar brought together approximately 106 participants including students and faculty members of the economics department.













III. Mind Scribbles: A Quiz







7. Career Counselling Session

The Economics Department JDMC organized an Alumni Talk on "Career Counselling-Strategies to Prepare for Entrance Exams" for the students of the Economics Department on October 1, 2022 via Google Meet.

The resource persons for the mentoring session were Ms. N. Akhila, an ex-student of JDMC who graduated from CESP, JNU, and Ms. Bhavya Palta, also an ex- student of JDMC, pursuing MA (Economics) from DSE, DU. Shruti Kumari, Coordinator of the Student Union, Economics Department, JDMC, introduced the speakers.

The session enlightened the students about how they can prepare for entrances after their undergraduation and what are the career options that they can opt for post MA (Economics). The speakers shared with the students that there are broadly three paths students can opt for after MA (Economics), mainly UPSC, corporate sector and pursuing PhD in Economics. They also discussed that some of the more popular job profiles for an Economics (Honours) student are those of a data analyst, research analyst and consulting services, hence they laid an emphasis on acquiring some software skills.

The speakers made students aware of the various esteemed institutes in India that offer post-graduation in Economics, such as, Delhi School of Economics, Jawaharlal Nehru University, IIFT, ISI, IGNOU, Madras School of Economics, University of Hyderabad, etc. They also suggested to the students that they should choose the institution from which they wish to pursue MA (Economics) keeping in mind the career path they are aiming for.

They advised the students to be thorough with their concepts of under graduation and also to practice past year question papers extensively in order to crack the entrance exams. They also shared a list of books that would be helpful for the same. They suggested the students attempt lots of mock tests for practice of entrance exams. They listed some coaching institutions as well that might be helpful for entrance preparation. The speakers expressed that clearing entrance exams is not difficult, only that one must be consistent in their efforts. E






8. Joy of Giving Week


















9. Mindfulness and Mental Health

The speaker highlighted the importance of mental health and mindfulness and also explained the importance of World Mental Health Day, which was celebrated on October 10, 2022. 10. Seminar on Understanding the Malnutrition Challenge in India

(under "Annual Lecture Series, 2022-23")

The Economics Departments of Janki Devi Memorial College has organized a seminar on "Understanding the Malnutrition Challenge in India" (under "Annual Lecture Series, 2022-23") for faculty and the students of the Economics Department on October 14, 2022 in room no.67.

The Program:

Vaanshi Kaushik and Shruti Kumari welcomed the audience and introduced the speaker.

The resource person for the workshop was Dr. Dipa Sinha, Assistant Professor, School of Liberal Studies, Dr. B R Ambedkar University, Delhi. The speaker was felicitated by Dr. Shilpa Chaudhary, Teacher- in- Charge, Economics Department, JDMC, with a small token of gratitude.

The session enlightened the students about malnutrition and the challenges faced by India regarding its redressal. The speaker threw some light on the South Asian enigma and the paradox that India faces, which is that the proportion of children that are malnourished in India is exceptionally higher than a country with such per capita income. She also emphasised the factors that affect malnutrition and the significance of the nutrition a child is provided in its initial 3 years of growth.

The speaker further made a comparison of Indian children with those in rest of the world in terms of malnutrition and also briefed about the indicators and causes of malnutrition, stressing on how the Covid- 19 pandemic only amplified the already poor situation of malnutrition in the country as well as globally. She also elucidated that malnutrition is a multi- dimensional issue and how in a deeply patriarchal society such as ours, women's burden increases even more as a cause and effect of malnutrition amongst children. The speaker spoke about the significance and the issue of affordability of good quality food and balanced diets in India. She also addressed the question of whether malnutrition is a behavioural problem or a resource problem.

She threw light on some of the key state interventions in India to address the problem of malnutrition such as National Food Security Act, Public Distribution System, Mid-Day Meal

Scheme, ICDS, Maternity Entitlements, etc., and the shortcomings that they face. The speaker expressed that the two main issues of malnutrition in India according to her are food security and gender disparity. She also explained the official definition of food security with the attendees of the event. With this, the speaker concluded her lecture and addressed all the queries of the students effectively.

Lea Chaudhary gave the vote of thanks. The seminar brought together approximately 96 students, including faculty and students of the Economics department. It was a very enriching and interactive session.


















11. Movie Screening and Discussion

The Economics Department JDMC held a movie screening and discussion session on the occasion of International Day for Eradication of Poverty on October 17, 2022 in room no. 68. The featured movie was 'Peepli Live', written and directed by Anusha Rizvi and produced by Aamir Khan Productions. The hour and a half long film shows the plight of a local farmer Natha, who is on the verge of losing his family's farm and so arrives at a unique solution to his financial predicament: suicide, because the Indian government supplies hefty payouts to the families of farmers who kill themselves. The movie is a satisfying satire on the plight of poor farmers in India, scorned by the rich and powerful who have their own plans of industrialisation for national progress.

There were around twenty students who attended the event. Attendance was poor because the event clashed with other events in which students were participating. The event was concluded with a vote of thanks by Rajasi, President of the Students' Union, Economics Department, JDMC.











12. Seminar on Group Discussions and Personal Interviews

The Economics Department, JDMC in collaboration with Eminent Strategy organized a seminar on "How to crack Group Discussions and Personal Interviews" for faculty and the students of the Economics Department on November 3, 2022 in the Seminar room.

The Program:

The Association-In-Charges Dr Bijoyata Yonzon and Dr Navpreet Kaur were present at the event.

Shruti Kumari and Nishi Rathore, Coordinators, Students' Union of Economics Department, JDMC welcomed the distinguished speakers, Dr. Komal Khatter and Ms. Richa Sharma. The session enlightened the students about Group Discussions and Personal Interviews and how to crack them.

Dr. Komal Khatter began the session by enlightening the students that each individual is different and that one often gets mind blocks in the name of group discussion.

She advised the students to never let confusion and nervousness show on their face. She also emphasized that the person who initiates and concludes the group discussion is very important. She advised the students not to be aggressive but assertive in a group discussion.

She elucidated that if anyone is silent, they can be an asset, as one can ask them 'yes do you agree with me', and since that person is blank their first reaction would be to agree with them. The speaker expressed that if the group discussion is deviating one should interject and say 'we are deviating, let us come back to the topic'.

She also spoke about the process of group discussion and the key skills required to crack group discussion such as hand movements, eye contact, body language, one should be formally dressed, hair should be neatly tied, heavy makeup should be avoided, and one should be simple, precise, assertive, fluent and enthusiastic. She also emphasized that one should greet everyone before initiating a group discussion and greeting should be practiced beforehand. She also shared some rules and tips for group discussion with the students.

The speaker threw some light on the various types of topics for group discussion like current affairs related, controversial topics, abstract topics, analytical topics, philosophical topics and case study situations.

Ms. Richa Sharma then spoke about personal interviews. She enlightened the students about the significance of personal interviews in corporate jobs and higher education institutions like IIM.


She also conducted a mock interview and shared feedback simultaneously.

The speaker elucidated about the procedure and the questions asked in personal interviews. She shared some tips about how to crack personal interviews while putting emphasis on introduction, personal branding, what makes one stand out from the crowd, internship experience, certifications/ technical knowledge, etc. She also laid emphasis on good event management skills, team building, positive attitude, time management skills, interpersonal skills, problem solving skills and being aware about one's own strengths and weaknesses.

Ma'am concluded the seminar by sharing some tips about how to build a resume and to make it Applicant Tracking System (ATS) friendly.

Vaanshi Kaushik, Vice President, Student Union, Economics Department, JDMC, concluded the event with a vote of thanks.


The seminar brought together approximately 50 students, including faculty and students of JDMC. It was a very enriching and interactive session.



14. Seminar on Labour and the Macroeconomy: The Indian Experience

The Economics Department JDMC organized a seminar on 'Labour and the Macroeconomy: The Indian Experience' under the Annual Lecture Series, for faculty and students of Economics Department on November 10, 2022 in the seminar room.

The Program:

The Association-in-Charges Dr. Navpreet Kaur and Dr. Devendra Kumar were present at the event.

Vaanshi Kaushik, Vice President of the Student Union, Economics Department, JDMC and Shruti Kumari, Coordinator of the Student Union, Economics Department, JDMC welcomed the distinguished speaker, Prof. Jayan Jose Thomas. Prof. Thomas was felicitated by Dr. Devendra Kumar. The speaker is a professor of Economics at IIT Delhi. The session enlightened the students about labour and the macroeconomy with a focus on India.

Prof. Thomas began the session by giving an example of the extremely poor condition of labourers in the 18th century Britain. He also drew a comparison amongst India, China and South Korea on the basis of GDP per capita. Sir also discussed how the net increase in working population is both an asset and a liability for India.

Professor also emphasized that India has great scope in human development and labour absorption. The investment rates of China and India from 1960 to 2020 were also compared, from which it was concluded that China is ahead of India. He also shared that majority of the working population of India is concentrated in agriculture and allied industries.

Sir elucidated that the demand for labour in construction and manufacturing sectors has slowed down and that 75-80% manufacturers of India work in small enterprises. He also expressed that there is a deepening mismatch between the potential supply and demand for labour in India which has led to a sudden increase in unemployment. The great disparity in the income shares in India between the top 10% and the middle 40% were also discussed.

The speaker also threw light on the falling shares of credit to micro and small-scale industries and how public investment can be helpful for equity, infrastructure and innovation. He also discussed with the audience whether wages should be increased or decreased to induce investments and revive the economy.

With this, the speaker finished his lecture and addressed all the queries of the students effectively.

Shruti Kumari, Coordinator of the Student Union, Economics Department, JDMC, concluded the event with a vote of thanks.
