
1. Webinar

‘Education and Print: Opening Up Vistas for Gender Equity in Early Twentieth Century India’

Date: 16th April, 2022

The Heritage Association, Department of History in coordination with Teacher In-charge (Dr. Manisha Sharma) and Association In-charge (Dr. Tara Sheemar) organised a webinar on Topic - "Education and Print: Opening up vistas for Gender Equity in early twentieth century India" on 16th April 2022 and the speaker for the webinar was Dr. Smita Sehgal, Department of History, Lady Shri Ram College.

The webinar was hosted by Sweta Mishra, General Secretary of the Heritage Union and Dr. Saroj R. Jha, Faculty of History Department, JDMC. In the beginning, Sweta Mishra welcomed everyone and then she invited Dr. Saroj R. Jha to take forward the event. Prof. Sandhya Garg (Vice Principal, JDMC) then addressed the gathering and pointed out how important the topic concerned was. Then Dr. Jha invited the speaker. Dr. Baba Saheb Ambedkar on


Date: 8th April 2022.



In the afternoon an international webinar titled, '*Peace and Violence: Contemporary Contemplations*' was organised. Dr. Vaidik delivered her talk on the theme of myth and violence and how they are connected to each other as well as to the present. The talk was followed by an interactive question and answer round with the students and faculty. The second speaker was Dr. Carsten Wieland, (German Diplomat and senior UN Consultant on the Middle East) Dr. Wieland delivered a very engaging talk surrounding the question of nationalism, ethno- nationalism, heritage and myths. He took Syria as an example to highlight issues of ethnicity and conflict especially in the context of post Arab Spring. The talk triggered many questions and an engaging interactive session followed thereafter. Day one of the festival concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Sheemar.


Day 2




Screenshot from the Saraswati Vandana at the inaugural






6. Open Mic Competition



Date : 24th September, 2021
