
Student's participate in the webinar- The Digital Divide in Education during Covid-19 and Strategies for Inclusion

Webinar on Bourdieu and the Sociology of Marginalization by Professor Sheena Jain





Webinar-Workshop on 1st Impression and Grooming by Aditi Khanna



Webinar by Prof. Tulasi Srinivas



Webinar by Prof. Maitrayee Chaudhuri






Webinar by Prof. Maitrayee Chaudhuri, February 18,202




Mock Drill with Students, January 28,2021

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Webinar-Workshop by Ilhaam Inclusive



Webinar on Women and Ancient Myths






Webinar on Prostitution/Sex Work : Asking the Right Questions

The webinar was attended by faculty members and students from JDMC and other colleges from the University of Delhi. It was an interactive, insightful and informative session and concluded with a question-answer session.








