At the time of preparing Audit Report, three members had completed Ph.D. At present, the department has four faculty members with Ph.D. and two faculty members have submitted Ph.D. So, the department will soon have six faculty numbers (out of ten) with Ph.D. in coming months.

The department has always worked in the direction of providing a wholesome learning environment to its students. We thank Prof. Bhanumurthy for his appreciation of our department activities and collaborations with agencies to encourage industry-academia linkages

In order to prepare ourselves for the forthcoming NEP, we plan to arrange webinars/ workshops to understand and facilitate the transition. Since we are a constituent college of Delhi University, we follow the curriculum as framed and prescribed by the University.

We understand the importance of research for our professional growth and we thank Prof. Bhanumurthy for emphasizing the same. We do plan to put more efforts into research and increase the number of publications. A. Students

The performance of students is impressive with respect to activity and participation. It stretches happily beyond the academic region such as the classroom and aligns meaningfully with co-curricular programmes. The idea of research at the graduate level is notable, expecting the student to delve deeper into the offered subjects and making her/him to study judiciously. The concept of placement at this stage may be deferred for the moment so one could go into its ramifications. One may see, therefore, that in a part of our paradigm, there is a sudden shift from learning to "achievement." Young minds in their late teens and early twenties are questionably drawn into the zone of individual success and narrow competition with the fellow learners. Let research flow spontaneously into the wider domain of collective learning and team-work, that might prepare the student to integrate with the meaningful social frame. This is no reflection on the college but is to do with the task that higher policy makers assign to an institution. The college in the present case should remain an institution of learning and intellectual enrichment.

B. Faculty

The faculty of the English department is extremely talented, equipped with specific teaching skills and engaged in study-oriented analytical endeavour. Their published work and areas of interest are conducive to effective performance in the classroom. They are also able to inspire students by example to expand the scope of study into investigating social issues. In this, FDPs as envisioned by the policy-makers may not sufficiently help. The requirement, instead, is to let the faculty have more interaction with students as fellow scholars than recipients of supposed wisdom. The FDPs put a great deal of unnecessary burden on the faculty to explore interests extraneous to the prescribed texts filled with valuable insights into human experience. Emphasis on questioning, disagreeing, finding alternatives to the existing ways may be more value-adding than mere techniques of knowing projected by the FDPs.

C. Best Practices of Department/Department initiatives

Under this head, good thought has gone into the widening of work to include speakers from outside the college for addressing the students and preparing them for confronting paradigms from their own. In this category though, speakers from the industry may be found wanting since they have a narrow vision and are best avoided. Inter and intra departmental exchanges are profoundly useful. So is the domain of expression linked with editing a magazine, organising theatrical performances and film-screenings, or conducting events at the college and the university levels. This gives a chance to the students to evolve a futuristic view and anticipate the working of the wider world they are to enter. For making it yet more meaningful, I may refer you to the elaboration of a few points in the next section.

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

Consider the *vision* of higher learning. It is a problematic area in the contemporary scenario. In that regard, my comment is not to do with the college department which is to follow guidelines from above, but with those who envision and formulate the guidelines. For us, the vision is not to be of individual success and its measuring in economic terms by the industry or whosoever wields social power. Indeed, the required vision is of providing vital human knowledge and scientific temper by the teacher and student together—there being no givers and takers of knowledge but those producing and sharing the knowledge together.

The *mission* is to produce knowledgeable and critically aware citizens with positive values of gender equality, questioning and self-questioning, tolerance of dissent, and resisting dogma. Are such values being considered a part of our mission, explicitly and emphatically? I am posing this question to the community of scholars in the places of higher learning.

The *future* of the department is intertwined with the activity of deeper analysis of texts and trends that are rooted in a structure of ideas and values. The more we shed the weight of quantifying work and instead adopt stressing the inculcation of the quality of thought and attitude, the more we would move towards a world of dignity. The motto: shed quantity, embrace quality.

In light of these, the academic schedule might be meaningfully examined and re-evaluated. That will take this institution of the talented staff led by a visionary Principal, and bright young students with stars in their eyes to unforeseen heights of intellectual fulfilment.

E. Additional remarks

The college has great potential. In it, the students are creative and motivated. The energy shows in their performances, academic and creative. The contribution of the Covid Resource Team during the Pandemic is praiseworthy. The college must strive to focus on pursuit of excellence in areas of thought and dynamic intervention. The faculty is innovative and committed. A changed perspective of education will suit the college entirely.

F. Overall comments and Grade

I also appreciate the resources the college possesses. The playgrounds, the well-equipped library, vast spaces filled with greenery, a big canteen where sitting and gossiping can add fun to knowledge-making, presence of senior staff on campus. This is well projected in the colourful ppt pages sent to me.

Grade: A-Plus

In his response to the English department's academic audit report, Dr. Prakash was highly appreciative of the department's academic and extra-curricular activities in spite the restrictions imposed by the Covid pandemic.

He was particularly happy about the research that the department faculty and students are involved in. The department had submitted three faculty and faculty led student project proposals this year, along with eight student proposals ranging from Existentialism to Witchcraft to the Research Centre of the college in the previous academic year; these projects will be completed very soon. We hope to continue this practice in the coming years

The faculty of English department doesn't engage in teaching alone, there is significant participation in the process of creating new syllabi at the university level as well as evaluation of exam scripts. English department's contribution to the corporate life of the college is praise worthy too. English department faculty oversee the annual production of the college prospectus, college magazine, creative writing competitions, debate club, western music society, the responsibilities of college PIO, Directorships of the newly set up centres, convenorship of the college website committee, online forms committee, the Fee Assistance Fund for students etc.

The students of the department are leading many student committees and societies, including the Research Centre. Their enthusiastic participation in academic and extra-curricular activities is a very positive sign of their growth as individuals.

This year, the department also offered Add-on Courses in Gender Studies as well as Proficiency in English that were widely appreciated with students from other colleges and universities also attending the courses.

To continue our efforts to provide exposure to academics and scholars of national and international renown, the department also hosted numerous webinars, a practice that we hope to continue.

The department intends to continue its efforts to provide the best possible academic experience to the students, while ensuring their development in all spheres. 1)शनिवार, 31 जुलाई 2021 को जानकी देवी मेमोरियल कॉलेज के हिंदी विभाग द्वारा प्रेमचंद जयंती पर 'प्रेमचंद का पुनराख्यान' विषयक संगोष्ठी का आयोजन किया गया।प्राचार्या प्रो. स्वाति पाल ने अतिथि वक्ताओं, प्रो. जगदीश्वर चतुर्वेदी एवं प्रो. रामचंद्र का स्वागत किया। प्राचार्या प्रो. स्वाति पाल ने स्वयं प्रेमचंद की कई कहानियों का अंग्रेज़ी में अनुवाद किया हुआ है।

हमारे पहले वक्ता प्रो. जगदीश्वर चतुर्वदी ने व्याख्यान का आरंभ करते हुए बताया कि प्रेमचंद एक उपन्यासकार होने के साथ एक बहुत बड़े आलोचक भी रहे हैं। 1936 में प्रगतिशील लेखक संघ के अध्यक्षीय भाषण में प्रेमचंद ने कहा था "हमने जिस युग को अभी पार किया है उसका जीवन से कोई मतलब ना था।" प्रेमचंद पूंजीवाद के सबसे बड़े आलोचक रहे हैं। प्रेमचंद का मानना था कि 'साहित्य का उद्देश्य जीवन की आलोचना है'। प्रो. जगदीश्वर ने आगे बताया कि अगर लेखक के पास ऊंचे आदर्श नहीं तो वह साहित्य को ऊंचा नहीं ले जा सकता। सिर्फ यथार्थ का चित्रण महत्वपूर्ण नहीं, आलोचना भी महत्वपूर्ण है और आलोचना कैसे की जाती है यह हमें प्रेमचंद जी से सीखना चाहिए।

प्रो. रामचंद्र ने अपने व्याख्यान की शुरुआत करते हुए बताया प्रेमचंद जी के लिए धर्म ही न्याय था। प्रेमचंद को दलित संदर्भ में गलत प्रस्तुत करने की कोशिश की गई। प्रेमचंद को चुनौती के रूप में दलित लेखकों के सामने खड़ा कर दिया गया ताकि दोनों में फूट डाली जा सके। प्रेमचंद बहस का केंद्र बन गए। दलित आलोचकों ने प्रेमचंद को पुनः जीवित किया है। प्रो. रामचंद्र ने गहरी बात के साथ अपना व्याख्यान समाप्त किया। उन्होंने कहा कि 'लेखकों में सच कहने का साहस नहीं है क्योंकि वह विचारों का जीखिम नहीं उठा सकते।'

Comments:

I start with a big applaud of congratulations to Human Development and Family Empowerment (HDFE) department, Janaki Devi Memorial College (JDMC) for nearing the mark of 4 decades and establishing roots and visibility as one of the popular streams in University of Delhi. The range of themes offered by the department (Child Development, Early Childhood Care and Education, Empowerment of Women and Children with Special Needs, Issues and Challenges of Adolescence) provides an opportunity to the students of BA programme a wide array of meaningful options for their knowledge and skill development.

As evident from the information received, it is heartening to see the overwhelming response from students for the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) offered through the CBCS mode. An increasing volume of students wanting to enroll and exceeding the sanctioned capacity of seats for courses tilted 'Life Skills Education', 'Introduction to Guidance and Counselling', 'Parent and Community Education' speaks for the recognition achieved by the courses. All the ten papers listed under the department (Principles of Child Development, Introduction to Human Development, Empowerment of Women and Children, Life Skills Education, Principles & Perspectives on Early Childhood Care and Education, Introduction to Guidance and Counselling, Child Rights and Gender Empowerment, Parent and Community Education, Children with Special Needs, Adolescent Development and Challenges) are significant and their contribution towards preparation of students for higher education in fields like gender, advocacy, social work, disability, early childhood education is worthy of appreciation. The course builds the knowledge and capabilities of students to development issues of life span and become active champions in bringing affirmative shifts in families and society. The themes of the department align well with the National Education Policy 2020 and prepare students to be active contributors in implementing the policy at ground level.

An online meeting of the faculty members of the Department of HDFE (Ms. Nirmala Muralidhar, Associate Professor and Ms. Prerna Butta, Assistant Professor) was held on 29th May, 2021 at 3:00 PM to review and discuss the report sent by external auditor and forwarded by the Principal on the Academic Audit (2020-2021) of the HDFE department.

The following suggestions have been made by the expert in the academic audit report (2020- 2021) of the Department of HDFE. Some of the suggestions are already been compiled to and few others being done informally. The suggestions and the guidelines stated by the expert are extremely relevant and will prove to be beneficial in the strengthening the course/department.

Some of the important points that emerged as a result of the discussion held in the meeting to plan a road ahead are stated below:-

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

1. It may be worthwhile to continue to track the pathways taken up by students not only for further education/ PG courses but also to understand the employment status of students.

The Department is in contact with the former students of the HDFE department through whatsapp groups and has collected information about their education and employment. We are also encouraging the students to post their current information on the JDMC website. We could include the information about the same in our future academic audit reports.

2. Aggressive efforts are required to increase advocacy of course.

We are constantly working on the visibility of the course on various platforms by organising multiple events like webinars, add on courses, short term certificate courses, internships, competitions, workshops and so on. We try to organise these events at different levels: Intradepartment, inter-department, intra-college, inter-college and inter-University.

3. Leveraging the college focus and continuous support from management for sustaining the diverse activities (outreach, extension, research, webinars, workshops). Supporting the HDFE department to increase visibility, recognition and a specialization status.

The institute is supporting the department in all its endeavors (workshops, internships, add on courses, FDPs, webinars, projects and so on) and also by encouraging multidisciplinary

projects. A few projects are funded by the research centre of the college. The college also provides technical support for conducting various events on the college online platform.

4. Sustained efforts to keep the course, themes and curriculum relevant with the needs of dynamic society are required.

The activities and events organised and conducted by the department are in keeping with the needs of the contemporary society. Efforts are made to offer diverse opportunities to students to encourage discussions, brainstorming, enhancing their skills, providing them the opportunities for hands on experiences and to discover their own selves. Although all the activities are designed to supplement the curriculum with webinars, community outreach, research projects, internships, add on courses and so on. Our main aim is to take learning beyond the curriculum

5. Simultaneously the professional development opportunities for faculty, opportunities for exchange and learning within intra-department/ intra-college/ inter-college/ inter-university, need to be made and sustained.

The faculty members of the department are actively engaged in attending FDPs, conducting add on courses, networking with NGOs, organising webinars on various topics, mentoring students in the Student-Faculty research projects, presenting paper based on student faculty research project in UGC conferences, publishing paper in International journal, receiving various awards from different organisations for coordinating events and working with the community and taking session as resource persons for various webinars (career counselling, in add on course on decoding Disability to name a few).

6. Continuous efforts to develop SMART measures (clear and unambiguous) of teaching effectiveness should be made.

This point is very well taken. We will definitely continue our efforts for teaching effectively. We are using various methods to make the teaching learning process interesting and effective. Some of the methods used by us and mentioned in the Academic Audit report (2020-2021) are: online internships, videos, virtual visits to the organisations, PowerPoint presentations, brainstorming, online workshops, audio visual aids, movies and activity/ games based learning to name a few.

We will continue to develop and introduce more SMART measures to make our teaching effective.

7. Conducting exit surveys with students to inquire what skills they have acquired and what more could be added, will help faculty understand the perspective of students and make the course student centric. Collating quotes from students and taking feedback after a few years from former students will also be helpful in ensuring the course content continues to align with market demands. While informal connections with students may be on, conducting formal alumina meetings with senior students, inviting former students to speak to the current enrolled students will be advantageous for students' growth. Encouraging interactions between former students and existing students will be beneficial in supporting the professional and career growth of students.

We are doing this informally. We will formalize it and suitably document it in future. We will plan to have a formal session, where we will invite our former students to interact with the present students which will encourage interactions between them and will definitely help them to gain information.

8. The greatest challenge perceived by me is the crunch experienced in recruiting adequate staff for the department. One permanent faculty member supported by an Adhoc faculty is an injustice to the course, faculty and students. Given the accolades received by the department, efforts are required to increase the strength of the department, along with the much required due recognition. This will facilitate favorable class sizes (teacher student ratio) and also provide an opportunity to students to choose the course as one of Generic Electives (GE)

This cannot be addressed by the faculty members as it falls under the purview of the college administration.

We intend to focus on the above mentioned points for the future course of action.

A. Students

Comments:

By and large the performance of students for the year under audit has been good. In the absence of data for previous years which can offer scope for comparison, one can comment only on the data for the existing year. The fact that 78 out of 102 students have graduated with a first division is by itself very good and encouraging for both the teachers and students. The results of second and third years are similarly gratifying. Since teaching and learning is being done under tremendous strain in the context of the pandemic, it would be important to ensure that students do not drop out of the courses due to personal hardships and lack of resources.

Collective student activities are one of the ways in which solidarities are built and the distances that the pandemic has produced can be bridged. These activities are important, therefore, not only for building a sense of community and bringing out the special skills and talents that students may possess, but also for sustaining camaraderie in these extraordinary times. I am happy that students have shown individual and collective motivation in continuing with college and department activities and pursuing individual enhancement through internships. According to the data for the year, only 6 students have undertaken internships. It may be worthwhile to see how the data compares with earlier non pandemic years and explore other possibilities of internships.

There are three salient activities of the Department centred around students: Politique, Pratibha and Speculo. Politique, the annual festival, saw numerous activities, around a pertinent theme – social movements and gender. I am happy to observe that the new education policy was also taken up as a theme for discussion. The research projects undertaken by students show diversity and are relevant to concerns among social scientists in contemporary times. I am curious to know how the project reports are disseminated and preserved for reference by future scholars. Since so much effort goes into the projects, it may be worthwhile to think of ways of giving them enduring form – as digital articles which may be accessed through links from the Department Website.

The data on alumni and achievers does not seem to be exhaustive.

B Faculty

Comments:

The Department has a strong faculty with substantial teaching experience and diverse areas of specialisation. Three faculty members have teaching experience of more than 30 years and three between 20 and 30 years. These members can anchor and provide leadership to the younger faculty members of whom three have between 10 and 15 years of teaching experience, four between 5 and 10 years and three below 5 years. It is also heartening to see that faculty members have been actively publishing in the audit year. While publishing is a long-drawn process, and it is difficult for everybody to keep publishing all the time, it is a positive sign that a fourth of the total faculty members published in the audit year in reputed journals and also wrote for digital news media, which has wider reach. In the absence of data for previous years, I can only surmise and also hope that other faculty members have been also actively involved in research and publication, which would figure in the data of coming years. Since the research interests of faculty members are diverse and also cluster around major areas of concern in the discipline, the Department should consider ways of making each thematic cluster a core around which research activities can be organized, with a view to publish. Monthly presentation of one's own research in the Department for feedback from colleagues and external experts could be considered.

The Department has been active in organising seminars and has also hosted an FDP. Given that we are living in an age of online teaching, the teaching tools and pedagogy appear to be commensurate to the requirements of the times. It would be worthwhile to think of how some of the tools and resources that are being developed now can be used to advantage in later years. Making reading material available to students, in particular those who read and write in Hindi must be addressed to ensure a fair field for all. While Hindi translations are important, some classics translated in Hindi are available with Vani Prakashan and with Delhi University, it may also be worthwhile to set up networks with other colleges to share resources.

I was wondering whether the current CBCS system allows for a wider basket of courses to be offered to students. Currently, there appear to be three courses from which students can choose.

C. Best Practices of Department/ Department initiatives

Collaborative seminars and conferences can be planned and executed with the view to bringing out Department publication.

Since the Department hold politique as an annual fixture and also a distinguished lecture series, it may think of transcribing the lectures, if it is not already been done, and prepare a digital archive of the lectures which can be accessed through links.

This is a good time to think of international collaborations, which could become a major strength of the Department.

The three student platforms – Politique, Pratibha and Speculo – are important for holding together the academic activities and collective identity of the Department. Politique seems to be well entrenched, and one would like to see it being organised autonomously by students, with perhaps a bit of steering by faculty members. Speculo seems to have a lot of potential too. It would be wonderful to see how it gets nurtured to allow critical thinking and writing by

students. Likewise, Pratibha seems to be a good way of mentoring students enabling them to look towards a future beyond college. It seems to be attracting students and I do hope students are able to benefit from it.

Inter-college collaborations are always enriching. The FDP held in collaboration with Ramanujan College is a step in the right direction.

D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

Comments:

The vision of the Department as stated in the report presented by it, is developing a spirit of critical enquiry among students and to prepare them for the challenges of the world as responsible citizens.

These may be met by sustaining and strengthening the collective activities of the Department.

Students must be encouraged to excel. Equally important is to help them develop skills that would enable them to make a space for themselves in the outside world. Reading widely and enhancing the craft of writing and presenting their ideas must be encouraged. This can be done within the space of the class as an activity integral to teaching and learning. A bit of handholding but a lot of autonomy to think and question is important.

The Department has a lot of potential. The faculty is fully capable to realising the vision of the Department.

Since the Department is not an isolated unit, it would be worthwhile to establish collaboration with other Departments in the College and across colleges, and importantly with the University Department – in its research activity – as well as activities which pertain to the shared academic world (discussions over curriculum improvement, new courses, examination work etc.)

Department of Political Science - Follow-Up Action 2020-2021

In response to the Academic Auditor's Report 2020-2021 generated by Prof. Amupama Roy, the Department of Political Science has prepared a "follow-up plan of action" with regard to the following key areas:

I. Student Activities

The Department will ensure that the students do not drop out of the courses due to hardships and lack of resources, especially during the tough times unleashed by the ongoing global pandemic. Many teachers from the Department contribute to the "students' fee assistance fund". Though the number of students pursuing internships has slightly reduced during the pandemic period, the Department will motivate students to show greater participation in such activities in the coming years. In order to inculcate a greater spirit of confidence among the students, the Department will encourage the students to play a more proactive role in organizing various extra-curricular events. On the academic front, some of the students have already contributed to the mission of Hindi translation of English reading materials. To further facilitate an easy access of relevant reading materials, the Department has decided to create its own "online library" which will contain e-books/e-articles in both English and Hindi languages. The Department will also form its own "students' alumnae association" to improve its association with the passed out students.

II. Faculty Activities

The Department has decided to organize "intermittent discussion sessions" wherein the teachers will make presentations on their upcoming books and ongoing research projects. A few teachers have already initiated research projects in collaboration with the other departments of JDMC (e.g. Poonam Kanwal has collaborated with Sulagna from the Philosophy department). Also, the Department is about to finish its own book-project under the supervision of Renuka Singh. The digitalized versions of the students' as well as teachers' research projects will be made available for future references. The teachers will continue with the practice of sharing study materials in both English and Hindi languages with the students. Besides, the Department will continue to invite experts and offer add-on courses for allowing better professional training of the students.

III. Department's Best Practices

Although some of the teachers (e.g. Rajshree Chandra and Deepshikha) individually continue to do research in collaboration with many Indian and foreign universities, the entire Department (under the supervision of Poonam Kanwal, Vijay Badetia, and Pavan Kumar) has formally agreed to collaborate with the Tripura University for materializing various academic activities, such as joint research and publications, collaborative workshops and seminars, and other possible forms of exchange programmes.

The Janki Devi Memorial College is one of the oldest constituent colleges of Delhi University, which has three permanent regular faculty members and 5 other members on adhoc basis in the Department of Sanskrit. The Sanskrit Department runs both the programmes B.A. Hons. and B.A. programme Sanskrit. It also offers Interdisciplinary Sanskrit Courses for other disciplines as well.

I observed carefully the Power Point Presentation prepared by the Sanskrit Department of JDMC. This PPT nicely presents the achievements and activities of the Department for the year 2020-21. This gives a brief academic account of faculty members, objectives fixed by the Department for itself and academic and co-curricular activities which took place during the assessment period, such as; research papers published or presented, Student Research Projects (going on), pedagogy methods for the online teaching and courses etc. The section related to students enlists their academic record, co-curricular activities, awards and honors. The presentation also indicates about future challenges and planes to meet out those challenges.

Albeit the Department of Sanskrit is highly active and vibrant but there always remains a scope for improvement and innovation.

Therefore, I would like to draw your attention towards a few points:

A. Student:

- a) The Graphical comparative presentation shows the improvement in the result of second year and third year, number of second divisions has been increased, that means the teachers have put a lot of efforts.
- b) Number of 1st divisions is lesser than 2nd divisions it implies that there is further scope of improvement.

B. Faculty:

- a) Teachers' involvement in the academic activities is very good. Participation of the faculties in the interdisciplinary programmes reflect the progressive attitude of the Department.
- b) Participation of the faculties in the corporate life of the college is good enough.
- c) The proper development of an institution requires permanent faculty members, therefore, permanent appointment should be made as soon as possible.

- C. Departmental initiatives:
- The Department has organized a number of academic progammes like Shloka a) Recitation Quiz etc. for the students to improve their knowledge and enhance their skills.
- b) Departmental Committee for Interdisciplinary discussion and debates can be initiated where the students and teachers from other disciplines may take part actively. This may be a good platform to inculcate moral values and introduce our heritage to the new generation.
- D. Vision, mission and future plans of the Department

At present department is running following Research Projects:

Now we are focusing on preserving traditional knowledge by learning śāstraic Disciplines, i.e., our faculty members and a few students have studied Bhagwad Gita every evening from 3 August 2020 to 14 January 2021. Now we are studying Valmiki Ramayan.

We are Promoting the use of the Sanskrit language in our teaching pedagogies.

Department of Sanskrit is working on a project, "Sanskrit Sahitya main Aanand" For this, we are researching various Sanskrit Shastras.

As advised by Auditor, we have reduced our focus on literature study. Now we emphasize understanding śāstraic Disciplines- we explain the grammar rules for every word of Sanskrit texts.

Our students read the Sanskirt texts during Lecture class with their teachers to learn how to Pronounce the Sanskirt language accurately.

We are teaching an Add on course on Sanskrit Grammar, titled "Sanskrit-Bhasha-Naipunyam." In this course, students learn to speak the Sanskrit Language

Our department has taken a Project with students on Epigraphy (Bharhmi Lipi)

Auditor advised us to Bring contemporary disciplines into Sanskrit Studies a) Linguistics, b) Computational Linguistics, e-learning, Digital humanities, c) Science and technology in Sanskrit (Āyurveda-Biology, Yogic sciences), d) Comparative studies (Literature, philosophy, religion) - For this Now we choose to teach "Linguistics" as a DSE paper for third-year students. Earlier, we used to teach Literature-based Papers.

We teach various Traditional Lipies in SEC (Skill-based enhancement Course for 2nd Hons.) We teach Computer Awareness of Skt to B. A. Program 3rd year students as SEC paper.

Auditor advised, "Language learning using a Language Lab" For this following steps were taken.

- a) Students are using speech recording and analysis technique during online teaching.
- b) For students, Sanskrit Association organized an inter-college quiz competition and Recitation competition on the eighth and eleventh February 2021, and two webinars, i. e., a National webinar on 23 June 2020 by Prof Girish Nath Jha from JNU and an International webinar on the 3 April 2021 by Prof Bal Ram Singh from U. S.
- c) In AECC Sanskrit, we are Interfacing our students with another department, i.e., Hindi, Maths, History, Political Science, etc.

Introducing multidisciplinary job-oriented disciplines: We offer GE Paper based on Epigraphy to History Hons students, Nationalism in Indian Literature to Pol. Sc. Hons Students. Sanskrit Linguistics to Hindi Hons. students.

We teach recitation of Mantras and shlokas to our students in SEC paper for enhancement of their skills.

- a) Vāstu with computer-aided design courses: we teach Basic Elements of Jyotish to B. A. program 3rd-year students.
- b) Yoga

We teach Yoga Philosophy to 3rd Skt Hons students in the paper "Art of Balanced Living" as DSE paper and "Yogsutra of Patanjali" to B.A. Program students as SEC paper.

c) Jyotişa with knowledge of computer-aided predictions :

We teach Jyotisha Shastra in 3rd Hons and to B. A. Program as SEC in Basic elements of Jyotish Shastra.

d) Specific mantras for healing/cure

We teach them to recite shlokas of Gita and Ramayan and to chant Vedic hymns.

e) Entrepreneurship and management: we teach our students "Self management in Gita" How Gita is relevant in the contemporary world. We can know ourselves.

COMMENTS AND GRADES

A: STUDENTS - The high percentage of first divisioners in the current two years is a clear indication of the excellent quality of the pedagogic practices that are in place in the department. It may be worthwhile to explore the reasons for the less satisfactory results of last years' graduates. This may help in seeing how the factors whose elimination in later years has contributed to a better outcome are, if possible, not allowed to reappear. This can be a sociological project for the faculty to undertake!!!!

GRADE: Good

B: FACULTY –The Department has a solid faculty, in terms of qualifications and publications, and the participation in research work and related activities is impressive. I hope this will be sustained in future as well, and for this, i urge that, among other things, the college be generous in freeing faculty members, as far as possible, from unnecessary tasks, often of a red tape kind, since red-tapism has seeped into academia from other kinds of bureaucracies, which serve no other purpose than that of bolstering hierarchies of officialdom. This is important so that teaching and research remain the fulcrum of the department, and thus leave less room for legitimate dissatisfaction and demotivation.

GRADE: Very Good

C: BEST PRACTICES AND DEPARTMENT INITIATIVES –A focus on Gender and on gender related issues is laudable. It may be meaningful to include topics such as ageism; epidemiology; and a reflexive look at the history of academia, from relative autonomy to a more market-driven enterprise. This can contribute to much needed awareness, and to a beginning for designing alternatives for current and future changes.

D: OVERALL COMMENTS AND GRADE The Department of Sociology, Janki Devi Memorial College is undoubtedly vibrant and well designed, with a praiseworthy combination of the imparting of academic rigour and encouragement of practical outcomes that are valuable and relevant for enhancing the quality of social life in and outside the college. The link up with institutions that give students an opportunity to 'practice' their sociology and to also equip them with skills that are inputs to 'the world beyond the classroom', reflects an alignment with the spirit that is the foundation of Sociology: ia subject that , ideally, is never confined in an ivory tower of intellectual hubris and privilege, but which is nourished by, and also nurtures, an informed participation in varied social contexts and issues of contemporary concern and interest.

GRADE; Very Good

The members of the Sociology Department held a meeting on the feedback and comments received on the Academic Audit Report 2020-21 from the expert for the necessary action and compliance.

The members of the Department welcomed the suggestion from the expert regarding holding of webinars on topics closer to the syllabus. Although the Department has been actively engaging in organizing webinars by experts on topics related to the syllabus; it was felt that there was still a need to organize more webinars for students on themes connected with certain courses like Research Methodology, Urban Sociology, and Environmental Sociology. Holding webinars on themes connected with these papers will further strengthen the understanding of the discipline of Sociology and equip them with ethos of research and develop a critical outlook on such relevant themes.

Further, as a part of strengthening the ethos of research and field work among students it was decided that students will be encouraged to take up a research project on themes/topics covered in the various courses from the syllabus. Incentives in doing research work on themes/topics closer to syllabus cannot be overlooked. First, it will offer a significant basis to the students to tackle with the syllabus, which is extensive. Also, it will provide them with an in-depth and critical understanding of the themes/topics in the syllabus and enable them to focus beyond textual understanding. In view of this at the start of every semester after giving sufficient exposure to the students of the themes/topics in each paper the faculty members will mentor and support students in identifying a research problem in their respective courses and formulate a proposal for undertaking a research project.

Finally, the Department engaged in making a review of the results and following reasons were listed out for comparatively poor results of the III year batch in the Result analysis 2019-20:

- 1. The result for the III year batch includes repeaters from 2015-2018 and 2016-2019 who have performed poorly.
- 2. Also, the poor performance could be as the OBE was introduced.
