



Founder of the College

(1900 - 1986)**

Shri Brij Krishan Chandiwala, the founder of Janki Devi Memorial College was born in 1900 in a reputed family. As the third son of a flourishing silver merchant's family, there were no domestic pressures on him to join the family business. After the early demise of his wife, he joined the freedom movement led by Gandhiji. His mother's entreaties to remarry fell on deaf ears. Brij Krishanji became a true disciple of Gandhiji. He went to jail several times during the freedom movement. When Gandhiji started the agitation against the Salt Law, Brij Krishanji took an oath to give up salt and sugar for life. He was forced to break this vow in the last days of his life on health grounds.

At Gandhiji's behest, he had a prayer temple built in a Harijan Colony. He started the Delhi chapter of the Bharat Sewak Samaj, an organization for the upliftment of the downtrodden.

In 1959, Shri VKRV Rao, the then Vice-Chancellor of Delhi University appealed to the wealthy philanthropists of the city to come forward to open girls' colleges in Delhi. It was then that Brij Krishanji, who had no children, donated all his inherited wealth to the family trust, Shri Banarsidas Chandiwala Sewa Smarak Trust Society, which, in turn, funded the establishment of Janki Devi Memorial College in memory of his late mother Smt. Janki Devi.

Today, Brij Krishanji is remembered for his social service and closeness to Gandhiji. When Nathuram Godse fired that fatal shot, Bapu fell into the arms of Brij Krishanji, who was sitting right behind him. Till his very end, this great visionary remained our mentor and guide.

They should not only have attained a certain academic milestone but should also have a heightened sense of social consciousness, a thorough knowledge of their rights and duties accompanied by the right attitude and the rigour to face the world as empowered young women.

Implementing these objectives is an entire team constituted by the Management (with a highly motivating Trust body), some of the finest Faculty of the University, a proactive non-teaching staff and extremely dynamic Alumnae. JDMC is proud of the disciplined way in which classes are held in this college with regular tutorials as well as remedial classes. The University rules regarding internal assessment, especially attendance are strictly followed by us and we do not believe in compromising with them. There is transparency and a democratic approach in all that is undertaken within the college so that the students can express their suggestions/grievances through various means such as the monthly student faculty meetings, the feedback forms and the open door policy followed by the college at all levels.

The central location of the college, the ease with which one can access it on the Metro line and the sight of the impressive building with lush greens, make it an ideal place for teaching and learning. The college has won several awards such as a Green Campus Award Best Managed College of the Year Award and girl centric Tertiary Education and Training award from WAGE. In the last Garden show of the University, the college bagged 8 prizes including the Rolling trophy, the Jagrani Memorial Cup! The college is well known for its many environmentally sound practices such as rain water harvesting, solar paneling, herbal garden, mechanised composting, paper recycling, e waste management and the development of the eco zones on campus. The ramps, the Braille sections of the library, the tactiles on the floors and the elevator are some of the ways in which we assist the physically challenged. Those who are economically marginalized are assisted through fee concessions and scholarships by us. Not only in terms of intellectual and physical nurturing, the college is very concerned about the emotional well being of the students. So we have counseling services of various kinds provided to the students with a visiting as well as on call counselor as also the workshops conducted by the Counseling agencies.

Students of this college not only receive the best of scholarly training but have ample opportunities to participate in a wide range of extra and co-curricular activities through the innumerable clubs and Societies such as sports, NSS, NCC, Western and Classical dance and music, debate, photography, creative writing, theatre, investment cell and so many more. The active Placement Cell of the college works tirelessly to provide placements/internships to our students. The Non collegiate Women's Education Board classes, the classes held for the SOL students and the Janki Devi Vocational Centre are further contributions of the college towards providing holistic education.

JDMC at Work to Ensure Safety During Pandemic & Lockdown

The college has been hard at work to ensure the safety of students and staff and to evolve innovative measures to combat the challenges confronting us due to the global pandemic.

To begin with, the college took every possible measure to increase sanitization with:

- ◆ Temperature checks.
- ◆ Aa hand washing facility at the gate itself.
- ◆ Provision of masks, gloves and disinfectant.
- ◆ Spraying of all areas with disinfectant at the college level as well as by the MCD.
- ◆ Cleaning all work areas with alcohol -based disinfectants every day.
- ◆ an instructional video about COVID prevention measures by the college physician, Dr. Chugh.
- ◆ Following rules and regulations of social distancing in a stringent manner.

The college felt a sense of shared responsibility and contributed a sum of more than seven lakhs to the PM Care Fund. The Alumnae Association too was involved in neighbourhood ration distribution. The NCC and NSS students were involved in social outreach activities during this period.

The safai- karamcharis, the malis, the guards and all staff members have worked, often even beyond the call of duty to keep the college functioning without any obstacles. During the lockdown phase the staff was skeletal but devoted to keeping the college clean and green. The Campus Caretaker was unfailing in his duties all through the lockdown period too as well as the employees who worked double shifts as security guards to keep the college safe and secure. Many non- teaching staff members chose to enhance their skills by attending workshops, seminars and other such programmes that hone their abilities.

Teaching learning, examinations and assessment have been meticulously carried out through online platforms by the dedicated faculty. The administrative, accounts and library staff along with all other non- teaching staff have been conscientious in fulfilling their duties and have carefully followed social distancing and sanitization norms. Activities and events of the college have been taking place virtually and the webinars held by the college have received much acclaim. The faculty have had regular meetings to deal with emergent changes. The academic audit was carried out.

The college is committed and equipped to handle the challenges thrown up by the pandemic and accepts them as opportunities to evolve and meet the needs of the students with renewed dedication.



◆ Planting of Saplings

Internationally renowned speakers, who are eminent in their respective fields, shared their views and expertise with the students and faculty members. Fifty lectures have already been held as part of this inter-disciplinary series. Each department of the college actively participated in organising these lectures; some of them were organized by the Clubs, Societies and Associations of the college. The students and faculty from across departments participated enthusiastically in all these lectures, thus generating a plethora of perspectives.

These sessions that took the form of lectures, seminars, lecture-demonstrations and scintillating performances have not only been dazzling in their brilliance but also reiterated the college's commitment to provide safe spaces to students for discussion on a range of subjects by exposing them to maestros, scholars, politicians, historians, writers, leading administrators, academics from India and abroad, Vice Chancellors, policy makers and experts from diverse fields. The series was formally inaugurated by a lecture by none other than the Hon. Vice President of India, Sh. Venkaiah Naidu on August 1, 2019 on the Founder's Day. Doyens like Dr. Raja and Radha Reddy, Prof. Irfan Habib, Sh. Jairam Ramesh have been some of our invitees.

Each session began with the planting of saplings by the distinguished guests. A plaque bearing their name has been placed alongside each of these saplings, which have been planted in the college garden; they include indigenous plants such as Ixora and Hibiscus. At the end of the year, nearly sixty trees and shrubs have been added to the college garden as part of the DSS vision, thus contributing to the bio-diversity and ecology of the Ridge area. The guests are encouraged to re-visit the college to watch the progress of the saplings planted by them that bear their names to commemorate their contribution. Speakers were also presented with souvenirs related to the college and its 60th Anniversary celebrations. The plaques presented to the speakers are inscribed with their names and pictures. Each session of DSS was addressed by the Principal, who spoke eloquently

about our illustrious founder, Sh. Brij Krishan Chandiwalla and his vision of JDMC before the Speakers were introduced formally, felicitated and invited to speak. Earnest discussion, questions and answers flowed freely as students and faculty interacted with the speakers. Each session of this series has resulted in unprecedented exposure to a galaxy of luminaries for the audience.

A series of six webinars were held during the period of the pandemic to keep the faculty and students engaged and stimulated.

◆ Greening the College with Indigenous Plants

Lush lawns, diverse plants and trees are not just an aesthetic feature but an intrinsic part of our college campus and its commitment to enhance bio-diversity. More than 250 trees and a hundred or more medicinal plants flourish in the campus. Trees like champa, amaltas, flame of the forest (palash), neem, banyan and guava are suitable keeping in mind the weather of Delhi and also have considerable health benefits. The choice of clove, turmeric, kaala baans (black bamboo), cardamom, amla (Indian gooseberry), tulsi (holy basil), sehjun (drumstick), javitri etc for the herb garden in this sixtieth year reiterate the interest in Ayurveda and a desire to raise awareness and green sensitivity in students. The saplings planted by the DSS guests too are a step in this direction. Most of these new plants are labelled for the benefit of students.

◆ Flash Mob by NRITYA, the Western Dance Society



This book is an account of the eighteen Delhis, from the legendary Pandavas' to the modern times. It is a compendium of pictures and descriptions of monuments and institutions of Delhi, and a first-person account of Bhajji's association with Gandhi and Nehru.

As the project unfolded, an inter-linked students' research project called "Rediscovering Delhi," also supervised by Dr. Gill and Dr. Sethi, arose out of the original project to encourage students to engage directly with the monuments and heritage of

Delhi. The students registered their impressions in a blog (<https://rediscoveringdelhi.travel.blog>) which is very popular. The blog is now in the process of being converted into a book.

A competition was held to choose the best logo to represent the theme of the celebration of sixty glorious years of the college. कृष्णा छात्रावास



कृष्णा छात्रावास जानकीदेवी मेमोरियल कॉलेज में नामांकित पूर्णकालिक स्नातक की छात्राओं के लिए एक निवास स्थान है। खूबसूरती से बने इस छात्रावास में 105 छात्राओं को एक सुंदर हरा भरा परिसर सुरक्षित और आरामदायक आवास मिलता है। 2018 में नवनिर्मित इस छात्रावास का उद्घाटन भारत के माननीय पूर्व राष्ट्रपति श्री प्रणब मुखर्जी द्वारा कॉलेज के संस्थापना दिवस एक 1 अगस्त 2018 को किया गया था।

छात्रावास के प्रत्येक कमरे में आवश्यक सुविधाएं और बालकनी की व्यवस्था हैं छात्राओं के लिए वातानुकूलित कॉमन रूम है। छात्रावास की दो मंजिले पूर्णतया वातानुकूलित हैं। हरे-भरे वातावरण के बीच भोजन की व्यवस्था हेतु छात्रावास में मैस है जो उच्चस्तरीय स्वच्छता के मानकों का पालन करती है यह इस छात्रावास की आकर्षक विशेषताएं हैं छात्राओं की सुरक्षा को लेकर छात्रावास में विशेष प्रबंध किए गए हैं जिसके लिए 24 घंटे गार्ड को तैनात किया गया है। छात्रावास सर्विलेंस सीसीटीवी कैमरे की निगरानी में रहता है।

Krishna Hostel

Krishna Hostel is a residence for full time under graduate students of Janki Devi Memorial College. It is located in a scenic campus near the Ridge area of Karol Bagh. The beautifully designed hostel provides safe and comfortable accommodation to 105 residents. The hostel building was newly constructed in 2018 and inaugurated by the Honourable former President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee on August 01, 2018, Founder's Day of the college.

Each room has ensuite facilities with a toilet and an attached balcony. A fully air-conditioned common room, 2 floors with AC fittings, open green area and a dining arrangement that conforms to high standards of hygiene are some of the attractive features of this hostel. Students' safety is taken very seriously and guards are deputed to provide security round the clock. The entire Hostel is covered through CCTV surveillance.

महाविद्यालय विशिष्टताएँ

महाविद्यालय का कार्य दिवस और समय: महाविद्यालय, सोमवार से शनिवार तक सप्ताह में 6 दिन खुलता है। कक्षाएँ प्रातः 9:00 बजे से प्रारंभ होती हैं और प्रातः 12:00 बजे से 12:30 बजे तक के अल्पविराम (ब्रेक) सहित शाम आठवें कालांश (पीरियड) के साथ समाप्त होती हैं। सभा असेंबली प्रातः 12:00 बजे से 12:30 बजे तक हर दिन आयोजित की जाती है। बुधवार को विभिन्न पाठ्येतर गतिविधियाँ हेतु प्रातः 11:45 बजे से 12:45 बजे तक विशेषलंबी सभा आयोजित की जाती है। इन सत्रों में उपस्थिति अनिवार्य है।

पहचान पत्र: नए शैक्षणिक सत्र (2020–2021) हेतु महाविद्यालय के पुनः खुलने पर, सभी विद्यार्थियों को संस्थान वास्तविक विद्यार्थी के रूप में उनके परिचय को साबित करने के लिए फोटो और आवश्यक विवरण सहित पहचान-पत्र दिया जाता। सभी विद्यार्थियों से अनुरोध किया जाता है कि मूल शुल्क-प्रति के साथ कार्यालय से संपर्क करें और सूचित तारीखों को अपना पहचान पत्र प्राप्त करें। सभी विद्यार्थी से अनुरोध है कि वे प्रत्येक दिन अपना पहचान पत्र साथ लाएं और मांग करने पर दिखाएं। विद्यार्थी से आवेदन पत्र प्राप्त कर और बैंक में ₹.50 के भुगतान पर महाविद्यालय द्वारा जारी प्रतिलिपि (डुप्लीकेट) पहचान पत्र प्राप्त किया जा सकता है।

महाविद्यालय पुस्तकालय: महाविद्यालय के पुस्तकालय संग्रह में शैक्षणिक और सामान्य दोनों मिलाकर, एक लाख से अधिक पुस्तकें और एक हजार पत्रिकाएँ (जर्नल) हैं। यह दिल्ली विश्व विद्यालय की प्रथम पूर्णस्वचालित पुस्तकालयों में से एक है और निःशुल्क फोटोकॉपी और इंटरनेट सुविधा उपलब्ध करवाती है। नए विद्यार्थी पुस्तकालय पहचान-पत्र जारी करवाने हेतु अपने पहचान-पत्र के साथ पुस्तकालय स्टाफ से संपर्क करें।

चिकित्सा कक्ष: विद्यार्थी और स्टाफ के प्राथमिक उपचार और अन्य आपातकालीन आवश्यकताओं की जरूरतें पूरी करने के लिए सभी कार्य दिवसों में प्रातः 10:00 बजे से 12:00 बजे तक चिकित्सा कक्ष खुला रहेगा। प्रभारी चिकित्सक, प्रो. डॉ. सुदेश कुमार चुग, एक वरिष्ठ सलाहकार, फिजिशियन, हृदय रोग विशेषज्ञ, मधुमेह चिकित्सक, जठरांत्र चिकित्सक और स्नायु विशेषज्ञ हैं।

कंप्यूटर प्रयोगशाला: हमारी प्रथम प्रयोगशाला का उद्घाटन प्रो. श्री राठौड़ द्वारा दिनांक 28.10.2005 को किया गया था। अब, हमारे पास विद्यार्थियों और संकाय के प्रयोग हेतु इंटरनेट कनेक्टिविटी सहित लगभग 130 कंप्यूटरों की तीन कंप्यूटर प्रयोगशालाएँ हैं।

सभागार: महाविद्यालय के पास प्रकाश और ध्वनि कक्ष सहित नया अदभुत उन्मुक्त सभागार है। यह मेजबान कार्यक्रमों को एक अलग सौंदर्य प्रदान करने वाला हरे-भरे वातावरण के बीच स्थित है। यहां 2000 से अधिक लोगों के बैठने की व्यवस्था है और सज्जा गृह (ग्रीनरूम) भी है।

कैंफेटेरिया: महाविद्यालय के पास एक विशाल कैंफेटेरिया है जो विद्यार्थियों और स्टाफ को उचित दर पर नाश्ते की विविधता उपलब्ध करवाता है। प्राचार्य, बर्सर, स्टाफ काउंसिल सचिव, स्टाफ एसोसिएशन के सचिव, स्टाफ सलाहकार और छात्र संघ के अध्यक्ष से मिलकर बनी कैंटीन समिति की देख-रेख में कैंफेटेरिया चलाया जाता है।

College Highlights

COLLEGE WORKING DAYS AND TIMINGS: The College observes a six day week from Monday to Saturday. Classes commence at 9.00 a.m. daily and end at VIIIth period, with a break between 12.00 noon to 12.30 p.m. On Wednesdays, there is a special long assembly from 11.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. for various extra-curricular activities. Attendance in these sessions is mandatory.

IDENTITY CARD: After the college re-opens for the new academic session (2020-21), all new students will be given an identity card with a photograph and necessary details to prove their credentials as a bona-fide student of the institution. Every student will be required to contact the office with the original fee slip and collect the identity card on notified dates. All students are required to carry the I - card to the college everyday and produce it on demand. Duplicate Identity card will be issued by the college on receiving an application from the student and on payment of Rs.50/- in the Bank.

TIME TABLE: Copies of the time-table for the session will be distributed and explained to the first year students on the Orientation Day, when students meet their respective teachers, or be given online. Time Tables will also be available on the college website as well as notice boards.

COLLEGE LIBRARY: JDMC's library is a repository of over one lakh books and one hundred journals, both academic and general. It is among the first fully automated libraries in the Delhi University and provides photocopying and free internet facilities. Newly admitted students should contact the library staff with their Identity card for the issue of library cards.

MEDICAL ROOM: JDMC's medical room will be open on all working days from 10.00 am. - 12.00 p.m to cater to first aid and other emergency requirements of the students and staff. The doctor in-charge, Prof. Dr. Sudesh K. Chugh, is a Senior Consultant, Physician, Cardiologist, Diabetologist, Gastroenterologist and Neurologist.

COMPUTER LABS: Our first computer lab was inaugurated by Professor Shirin Rathore on 28/10/2005. Now, we have three computer labs with nearly 130 computers with internet connectivity for the use of students and faculty.

AUDITORIUM: JDMC has a unique open air auditorium with a fully equipped lights and sound room. Situated amidst lush green surroundings that lend a special charm to the functions it hosts, it seats more than 2000 people and also has green rooms.

CAFETERIA: The College has a spacious cafeteria that offers a wide variety of snacks to students and staff at reasonable rates. The cafeteria is supervised by a Canteen Committee consisting of the Principal, Bursar, Staff Council Secretary, Staff Association Secretary, Staff Advisors Canteen Committee members and the President of the Students' Union.

COLLEGE GARDEN: The College gardens are a constant source of pride. We have won many prizes in different categories. The Rock Garden has won the 1st prize at the University Flower Show.

PIO's ROOM: The Public Information Officer of the college is available during college hours.

STUDENTS' UNION: JDMC has an active Students' Union guided by designated Staff Advisors. It regularly organises cultural shows, seminars and workshops, the most exciting of them being 'SYMPHONY', the annual inter-college cultural festival of JDMC. Union members are elected once a year and help students, who have any problems. The Students' Union comprises of 4 elected members - President, Vice President, General Secretary and Treasurer and 3 nominated members: Drama Club Secretary, Debate Club Secretary and Music & Dance Club Secretary.

ALUMNAE ASSOCIATION: On the occasion of our Golden Jubilee, we created an extensive database of our alumnae, who have proved themselves academically and professionally. Our illustrious alumnae include academics, lawyers, bureaucrats and professionals. Many of them are currently heads of various educational institutions all over the city.



एनसीसी कैडेटों को सीडीएसई (यूपीएससी द्वारा आयोजित) की लिखित परीक्षा देने से छूट दी गई है और वे सीधे प्रवेश के लिए एसएसबी साक्षात्कार देने के लिए भी पात्र हैं। महिला अर्धसैनिक बलों के तहत, एनसीसी कैडेटों को आरक्षण दिया जाता है। 'सी' प्रमाण-पत्र धारकों को लिखित परीक्षा से छूट दी गई है। एनसीसी कैडेटों को पैराशूटिंग, पैराग्लाइडिंग और आधारभूत विमानन पाठ्यक्रम जैसे अन्य कौशल भी सिखाए जाते हैं, जिससे छात्रों को सशस्त्र बलों के लिए आवेदन करते

समय दूसरों से बढ़त मिलती है। जेडीएमसी एनसीसी को 15 जुलाई, 2019 को दिल्ली के एनसीसी एल्युमिनी क्लब द्वारा ऑल इंडिया बेस्ट सीनियर विंग कॉलेज की राष्ट्रीय श्रेणी में एनसीसी अचीवर अवार्ड 2019 से सम्मानित किया गया।

राष्ट्रीय सेवा योजना (एनएसएस) जानकी देवी मेमोरियल कॉलेज की एनएसएस ईकाई, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की एनएसएस ईकाई से संबद्ध है। एनएसएस के लिए पंजीकृत छात्रों को रक्तदान शिविरों के आयोजन, सामुदायिक सेवा, अस्पताल सेवा आदि जैसे कार्यक्रमों को अपनाना होता है। वे गणतंत्र दिवस परेड, उत्तर-पूर्वी युवा उत्सव, एनएसएस मेगा शिविर, राष्ट्रीय युवा सम्मेलन, वृक्षारोपण, एड्स जागरूकता और पर्यावरण जागरूकता जैसे कार्यक्रमों में भाग ले सकते हैं। एनएसएस की सदस्यता दो साल के लिए होती है जिसमें 240 घंटों की कार्य-सेवा देनी होती है और सात दिन का विशेष शिविर अनिवार्य है। एनएसएस का उद्देश्य अपने प्रत्येक स्वयंसेवकों में, निःस्वार्थ समाज-सेवा की भावना और समुदाय के हित के लिए काम करने की जीवनभर प्रतिबद्धता निहित है।

College Societies

National Cadet Corps (NCC): The NCC cadets have won accolades in shooting, firing, drill and line competitions. The NCC Programme ends with the certificate examination every year. NCC cadets are exempted from giving written test of CDS Exam (conducted by UPSC) and are also eligible to give SSB interview through direct entry. Under women paramilitary forces, NCC cadets are given reservations.

C-certificate holders are exempted from written exams. NCC cadets are also taught other skills such as parachuting, paragliding and basic aviation courses because of which they have an edge over others when applying for the armed forces. JDMC NCC was awarded the NCC Achiever's Award 2019 in the National Category of 'All India Best Senior Wing College', by NCC alumni Club of Delhi on July 15, 2019.

National Service Scheme (NSS): NSS unit of JDMC is affiliated to the NSS unit of Delhi University. Students who register for NSS take up projects like organizing Blood Donation Camps, volunteering for Community service, Hospital service, etc. They can participate in events such as the Republic Day Parade, North East Youth Festivals, NSS Mega Camps, National Youth Convention, plantation programmes, AIDS awareness and environment awareness programmes. NSS membership is for two years in which completion of 240 work hours and a seven day special camp is mandatory. The NSS aims to inculcate, in each of its volunteers, a spirit of selfless social service and a life-long commitment to work for the benefit of the community. An NSS volunteer may become eligible for the Indira Gandhi award if she fulfills the criteria which are available at nss.du.ac.in.

National Sports Organisation (NSO): The Sports organization is run by the Physical Education department of the college and is affiliated to the Delhi University Sports Council (DUSC) and the National Sports Council. Apart from encouraging our students to engage in yoga, aerobics, and swimming, we organize various activities and Inter-departmental competitions for different sports to motivate and to raise health awareness among all. Students get the opportunity to participate at college level, at state level and at international level. This in turn, helps them get government jobs, for example with the railways, police and armed forces. They also get scholarships, cash awards and recognition from national and international bodies.

- (a) Twenty percent of the students of the College, in addition to those belonging to SC, ST, are eligible for fee concession. Application forms for stipend are available in the office. The forms, duly filled, should be submitted to the office.
- (b) Concessions for Physically Challenged Students: A special stipend for physically challenged students is available.

Please contact the College Office.

- (c) Students' Aid Fund renders financial assistance in the form of bus fare, fees for college sponsored vocational programmes and books on a long term loan from the Book Bank in the library.
- (d) The University awards All India Entrance Scholarships (50 in number) worth Rs. 250 per month each. The scholarships are to be awarded on the basis of a test in October.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective or skill based courses. The courses will be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce a uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

1. Core Course: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement, is termed as a Core course.
 2. Elective Course: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/ subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective courses (may be offered by the main discipline/ subject of study) referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/ Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/ subject of study).
 - 2.2 Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/ advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
 - 2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/ subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.
- P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/ subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

Courses of Study

3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course: The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. They ((I) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication) are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

3.1 AE Compulsory Course (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/ MIL Communication.

3.2 AE Elective Course (AEEC)/SEC: These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value based and/or skill-based instruction.

Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing/exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

Courses of Study

There are 3 streams in each language and the option for choosing Hindi and Sanskrit language is contingent upon whether the student has passed a language test at Class XII, Class X or Class VIII level. Stream A implies that the student has successfully passed English/Hindi at the level of class XII. Stream B means that the student has passed English/ Hindi at the level of class X. Stream C means that the student has passed English and Hindi examination at the level of Class VIII. The allocation of A, B, C streams in English language will now be contingent on the marks awarded to a student in English in class XII, as per D.U. rules.

Those students, who have not studied Hindi at any of these levels, are offered Philosophy in lieu of Hindi. Students who have not studied Hindi upto class VIII are expected to take the compulsory Hindi exam within three years of joining college.

Note : Students who have not offered Vocal Music as a subject in class Xth or XIIth or have not passed any Music Examination from any other school but wish to take Music as a subject may have to appear for a Music Test.

NOTIFICATIONS

1. After declaration of the cut off lists by the University, the student will need to report to the college of her choice for admission within the stipulated period. The student would then get her documents verified and pay the admission fee.
2. In case, a student cancels her admission in a college, in order to move to another college on declaration of a subsequent cut off list or needs certificates for institutions outside Delhi University, the college must promptly return the documents to the student.
3. No student will be allowed to take admission in two courses/colleges simultaneously. In case, they are found to be admitted in two courses/colleges simultaneously, their admission will be cancelled.

Concession/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons With Physical Disabilities (PwD)


1. Consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University, the following proviso has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X(4) of the said Ordinance:
"Provided that the Persons With Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fees payable including the Examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students' Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing under-graduate, post-graduate or other courses in the University or its Colleges."
2. In pursuance of the above, the students with physical disabilities pursuing various courses of study in the Faculties, Departments, Centers, and Institutions/Colleges of the University shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee.
3. In pursuance of the Executive Council Resolution No. 50 dated 03.11.2012, it is notified that the students with physical disabilities residing in different Hostels/Halls of the University are exempted from payment of all hostel fees and charges except refundable caution fee and the mess fees. The Persons with Physical Disabilities students shall pay 50% of the Mess fee and the remaining 50% of the Mess Fee in respect of the PwD students is being met by the University. Similar norms are to be adopted by the Colleges in respect of PwD Students residing in various hostels of the Colleges.

It is clarified further that the PwD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges/mess fees subject to the following conditions:

Value of Fellowship	Exemption of Fees Waiver etc.
Up to Rs. 3000/- per month	Fees waiver+50% Mess Subsidy
Rs.3001 to 8000 per month	Fees waiver but no Mess Subsidy
Rs. 8001 and above per month	No fees waiver and no Hostel Subsidy

ATTENDANCE RULES AND CREDITS

Ideally a student should attend all lectures, preceptorials, tutorials and practical classes held during the Semester in all the subjects (or papers). In case the student is unable to do so, then she/he must have:

- A minimum of 66.67% attendance in lectures, preceptorials, tutorials and practical classes separately in all the subjects (or papers) for all the six semesters of the course. Failing this, she/he will not be permitted to appear in the university examination.
- Please note that 66.66% attendance is also required in each course separately in each Semester, failing which the student will be detained.

Students who have missed classes on account of:

- I. A serious disabling illness
- II. Participation in Sports activities
- III. Participation in an Inter-College, inter-University event

should submit a medical/participation certificate duly signed by Teacher-in-charge at the college administrative office within 10 days of returning to college after recuperation/return.

Attendance of detained candidates will be calculated afresh for the Semester she has rejoined. Attendance for the Semester already passed will, however, remain unchanged.

Students failing to attend a minimum of 66.67% of the lectures/ tutorials / preceptorials / practical classes will not be permitted to appear in the University Examination.

5% weightage awarded for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials shall be calculated as follows:

85% and above	5 marks
80% or more but less than 85%	4 marks
75% or more but less than 80%	3 marks
70% or more but less than 75%	2 marks
67% or more but less than 70%	1 mark
Less than 67%	0 marks

Every student admitted to the College shall be compulsorily required to sign an undertaking that she shall fulfill the minimum attendance requirement.

The monthly attendance of student shall be uploaded on the college website.

Parents/guardians are requested to keep track of their ward's attendance in classes. They may note that if their ward falls short of the minimum attendance requirements, she shall not be permitted to appear in the examinations.

Smoking and consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited in the campus. The college is a smoke free zone and the Nodal Officer for anti-smoking campaign is Ms. Vandana Madan, Convernor, Avani.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT: ORDINANCE VIII-E

- 1.1. The scheme for Internal Assessment shall be followed in the regular stream only, with exclusions as per the Appendix (at Page 6), and shall be applicable to the students admitted from the academic session 2003-04 onwards (i.e. to begin with for the first year students) in both undergraduate and postgraduate degree courses. This scheme of Internal Assessment shall not be applicable to the School of Correspondence Course and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and Non-Formal Education Cell (formerly External Candidates Cell). The specific Ordinances pertaining to schemes of examinations of various courses shall stand amended, mutatis mutandis, to the extent of internal assessment as laid down in this Ordinance, subject to exclusions referred to above.
- 1.2. Internal Assessment marks shall be shown separately in the Marks Sheet issued by the University and these marks shall be added to the annual/semester examination marks for determining the division of the student. 25% of the maximum marks in each paper in undergraduate courses shall be assigned for Internal Assessment and the remaining 75% marks for the annual/semester University Examination; the time duration and other modalities of the annual/semester Examination with respect to this 75% component shall remain as per existing schemes of examination for various undergraduate courses.
- 2.1.1. There shall be 10% weightage assigned to House Examinations to be conducted by each college, for all subjects in Pass course and B.Sc. (General) and all papers of the main Subject in Honours courses.
- 2.1.2. The duration of each paper in the House Examination shall be the same as the duration in the University Examination. The maximum marks for each paper of the House Examination shall be 100 or the same as the maximum marks in the corresponding University Examination.
- 2.1.3. The University reserves the right to scrutinize some or all the scripts of any paper in any course in a College during the period of retention of papers, Which duration shall be till declaration of results by the University, a copy of the question paper shall be sent to the Examination Branch of the University and the College shall maintain a proper record of the question papers of the House Examination.
- 2.2.1. Each student shall be assessed on the basis of written assignments/tutorials as well as on the basis of project reports/term papers/seminars. There shall be 10% weightage for such written assignment; and project reports/presentations/term papers/seminars. Each student shall be given at least one written assignment per paper in each term, subject to a maximum of 12 written assignments per year for all the papers taken together.
- 2.2.2. Where the maximum marks in a paper are less than 100, for example 50 marks, the nature of written assignments/ tutorial work shall stand adjusted *pari passu*.
- 2.2.3. There shall be 5% weightage for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials, and the credit for regularity in each paper, based on attendance, shall be as follows:
 - More than 67% but less than 70% -1 mark
 - 70% or more but less than 75% -2 marks
 - 75% or more but less than 80% -3 marks
 - 80% or more but less than 85% -4 marks
 - 85% and above -5 marks

[Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).]
- 2.2.4. There shall be a Moderation Committee for Internal Assessment in each College, discipline-wise, which shall comprise of the senior most teacher in the department, the teacher-in-charge of the department and the previous teacher-in-charge of the department: provided that if, for any reason, the membership of the Committee falls below 3, the Principal of the college shall nominate suitable members from among the teachers of that department/college to fill the vacancies.
3. With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly.
4. The promotion criteria shall be as per the existing Ordinances for University Examinations, as applicable to respective courses. In addition, the same criteria shall apply to the total of the University Examination and the Internal Assessment, taken together.
- 5.1. There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment at the University level consisting of the Dean of Colleges as the Chairperson along with three other Deans one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Council, and the Controller of Examinations as Member-Secretary. The Committee shall monitor the receipt of Internal Assessment marks from various colleges and ensure timely compliance. If a College fails to submit the Internal Assessment marks in time, the University shall not declare the result for such a course in that College.

The responsibility for non-declaration of the result of any course in the college in such circumstances will be solely that of the college.
- 5.2. There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment in every College, which shall be chaired by the Principal of the College and will be made up of the Vice-Principal (and in case there is no Vice-Principal, the Bursar), Secretary Staff Council, and two

senior faculty members to be nominated by the Principal. This Committee shall be responsible for the entire process of Internal Assessment in the College, including redressal of grievances, if any.

- 6.1. In the case of students who repeat one or more paper (s), or all papers of Part I or Part II or Part III, the Internal Assessment marks shall be carried forward.
- 6.2. In the following special cases, in lieu of Internal Assessment, students shall be awarded marks (for the previous years papers) in the same proportion as the marks obtained in that paper in the University Examination:
 - 6.2.1. Students who migrate from other Universities to the University of Delhi in the IInd Year;
 - 6.2.2. Students who fail in the Part I Examination of Honours Courses and join Pass/General Courses in the IInd year; and
 - 6.2.3. Students who transfer from 1st year Pass/General Courses to Honours Courses in the 2nd year.
- 6.3. Students who migrate from non-formal streams in the University of Delhi (i.e. School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and Non-Formal Education Cell, formerly External Candidates Cell) to the Regular stream and vice versa, shall carry as such the marks obtained in the preceding year(s).
7. Tutorials shall be held regularly for the post-graduate courses of the University by the concerned Department in cooperation with Colleges; and at least 25% marks shall be assigned for Internal Assessment in each paper of the post-graduate courses. The Internal Assessment in the post-graduate courses may be based on regularity and attendance; class tests and house examination; and written assignments, projects / term papers / seminars / fieldwork. Post-graduate courses where the weightage of Internal Assessment is 25 per cent or more, Departments may continue with the existing schemes.
8. In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C. to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignments by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or in national or international fixtures in games and sports approved by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter-University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia or social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extracurricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply :
 - 8.1. A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfil the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however, that he/she may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.
 - 8.2. A student in the categories listed above, who is unable to write the House Examination on account of his/her participation in such aforesaid activities, may be assessed by the College through an alternative mode in lieu of the House Examination. This may be done only in exceptional circumstances.
 - 8.3. A student in the categories listed above, will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.(9)(a)(i).
- 9.1. The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary moderate the marks in Internal Assessment in any paper/ papers in any College/Department.
- 9.2. The respective University Moderation Committees in each subject shall moderate, if necessary, the Internal Assessment marks across Colleges.

अनुशासन और अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही से संबंधित सभी शक्तियाँ वाइस चांसलर में निहित हैं।

वाइस चांसलर अपनी सारी या कुछ शक्तियाँ जैसा वह उचित समझें प्रोक्टर को और किसी अन्य व्यक्ति को जिसे वह इस संबंध में निर्दिष्ट करे, को सौंप सकता है।

अध्यादेश के तहत अनुशासन के अनुपालन हेतु शक्ति की व्यापकता के प्रति बिना किसी पूर्वग्रह के निम्न उल्लिखित कार्यों को घोर अनुशासनहीनता का कार्य माना जाएगा:

1. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में किसी भी छात्र और किसी भी संस्था/ विभाग के शिक्षक वर्ग और गैर शिक्षक वर्ग के किसी सदस्य पर शारीरिक हमला या शारीरिक शक्ति के प्रयोग की धमकी।
2. हथियारों को अपने पास रखना, उसका प्रयोग करना या उसके प्रयोग की धमकी देना।
3. सिविल राइट्स प्रोटेक्शन ऐक्ट 1976 के प्रावधानों के किसी तरह का उल्लंघन।
4. अनुसूचित जाति या जनजाति से संबंधित छात्राओं की स्थिति, गरिमा और सम्मान का उल्लंघन।
5. औरतों के प्रति किसी भी तरह के मौखिक या अन्य प्रकार से किए गए अपमानजनक कार्य।
6. किसी भी तरह की रिश्वत देने का प्रयास या किसी भी तरह का भ्रष्टाचार।
7. संस्था की संपत्ति का जानबूझकर नाश।

Rules and Regulations

Code of Conduct

Students should avoid the following :

- Causing Disturbance in or outside rooms, the office, the library and the playgrounds.
- Refusal to participate in co-curricular or extra-curricular activities of the college or perform duties assigned to them.
- Misconduct or misbehavior of any kind especially during elections or students' meetings.
- Damage to the college building, property and books is strictly prohibited.
- Loitering outside the college gates is not allowed.
- Using or charging mobile phones in classrooms and corridors is strictly prohibited.

Students should comply with the following:

- Attendance in long assemblies on Wednesdays is compulsory.
- Membership of the college library is compulsory.
- Parents/Guardians are requested to cooperate with the college authorities in maintaining discipline and decorum in the college.
- Students are expected to be respectful to the faculty and staff of the college.
- Students should regularly see college notice boards and website for important information.

Ordinance XV-B. Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - (a) Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
 - (b) Carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapons;
 - (c) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976;
 - (d) Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes.
 - (e) Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
 - (f) Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
 - (g) Willful destruction of institutional property;
 - (h) Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
 - (i) Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system;
 - (j) Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.

JDMC students are required to conduct themselves in a disciplined manner in the college premises and outside.

1. अनुशासन के अनुपालन तथा अनुशासन को बनाए हेतु उठाए गए कदम जैसा कि उन्हें उचित प्रतीत होता है, से संबंधित शक्ति की व्यापकता के प्रति बिना किसी पूर्वाग्रह के कुलपति अपनी उपरोक्त शक्तियों का प्रयोग करते हुए आदेश या निर्देश दे सकते हैं कि समस्त छात्राओं में से कोई भी छात्रा –
 - क. निष्कासित की जा सकती है, या
 - ख. कथित समय के लिए निकाली जा सकती है, या
 - ग. कथित समय के लिए नहीं, विश्वविद्यालय की संस्था या विभाग, कॉलेज में पाठ्यक्रम के अध्ययन हेतु स्वीकार की जा सकती है, या रोकी जा सकती है।
 - घ. निर्दिष्ट धनराशि का उस पर जुर्माना किया जा सकता है।
 - ङ. एक या एक से अधिक साल के लिए विश्वविद्यालय या कॉलेज या परीक्षाओं से वंचित किया जा सकता है।
 - च. परीक्षा में छात्रा का परीक्षाफल या परीक्षा से संबंधित छात्रा या परीक्षा जिसमें वह उपस्थित हो चुकी हैं, को रद्द किया जा सकता है।
 - छ. कॉलेजों के प्राचार्यों के पास अपने कॉलेज के छात्र/छात्राओं पर अनुशासनात्मक शक्तियों के प्रयोग हेतु समस्त अधिकार सन्निहित होंगे। वे अपने अधिकारों का प्रयोग स्वयं या इस उद्देश्य के लिए हुए विभाग या संस्था या अपने कॉलेज के शिक्षकों को सौंप सकते हैं।

दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की तरफ से जो नियम बनाए गए हैं, ज़रूरत पड़ने पर पूरक के रूप में कॉलेज के परसिपिल उसका इस्तेमाल कर सकते हैं। प्रत्येक छात्राओं को इन नियमों की एक प्रति मुहैया कराई जाएगी। कॉलेज में दाखिले के समय हर विद्यार्थी को कुलपति और अन्य प्राधिकारियों के अनुशासनात्मक अधिकार क्षेत्र के तहत विश्वविद्यालय की तरफ से अनुशासन को लेकर बनाए गए अधिनियमों विधियों और प्राधिकारियों के अनुशासनात्मक अधिकार क्षेत्र तरफ से अनुशासन को लेकर बनाए गए अधिनियमों विधियों और अध्यादेशों से जुड़े घोषणा पत्र हस्ताक्षर करना होगा।

अध्यादेश 15 रैगिंग की मनाही तथा सजा:

1. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की किसी भी हिस्से में रैगिंग किसी भी तरह से संस्था या कॉलेज/विभाग के परिसर में अथवा जन परिवहन में सख्त मना है।
2. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी हिस्से में रैगिंग किसी भी तरह से संस्था या कॉलेज/विभाग के परिसर में अथवा जन परिवहन में सख्त मना है।
3. किसी भी व्यक्ति या समूह के द्वारा रैगिंग को अंजाम देना एक घोर अनुशासनहीनता का कारण माना जाएगा और उससे इस अध्यादेश के तहत निपटा जाएगा।
4. इस अध्यादेश के अनुसार रैगिंग का तात्पर्य प्रभावशाली या वरिष्ठ छात्रों द्वारा नवागंतुक नामांकित छात्रों पर या कनिष्ठ छात्रों पर किसी व्यक्ति या समूह द्वारा किया जाने वाला कार्य, आचरण या अभ्यास जैसे—
 - क. शारीरिक हमला या शारीरिक शक्ति के प्रयोग की धमकी।

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The Principal appoints a board of faculty members to take care of discipline among students with power to deal with breach of discipline.

4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any students of the University:
 - (a) be expelled; or
 - (b) be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or check
 - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Department Examination for one or more years; or
 - (f) that the result of the student or students concerned in the Examination or Examination in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. The Principals of the Colleges shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Department as they may specify for these purposes.
6. The rules framed by the University may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principal of the college. Each student is expected to provide herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission every student shall sign a declaration that on admission she shall submit herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice Chancellor and the several authorities vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, Statutes and Ordinances framed by the University.

Ordinance XV-C. Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which
 - a) Involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) Violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - (c) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem;
 - (e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo motto enquire into any incident

5. रैगिंग से संबंधित किसी भी तरह की सूचना मिलते ही कॉलेज की प्राचार्य तुरंत कार्यवाही करेंगी।
 6. उपरोक्त अनुच्छेद 4 में दी गई समस्त सूचनाओं के बावजूद, प्रोक्टर स्वयं रैगिंग की घटना के संबंध में जाँच-पड़ताल कर सकता है और उस घटना की प्रकृति और रैगिंग से जुड़े छात्रों के पहचान का विवरण बना कर वाइस चांसलर को भेज सकता है।
 7. प्रोक्टर रैगिंग की घटना की प्रकृति और रैगिंग जैसे दुष्कृत्य को अंजाम देने वाले छात्रों की पहचान से संबंधित प्रथम विवरण जमा कर सकता है।
 8. कॉलेज की प्राचार्या, विभागध्यक्ष या संस्था या प्रोक्टर को किसी कारणवश ऐसा प्रतीत हो कि इस तरह की जाँच-पड़ताल करना तार्किक रूप से व्यावहारिक नहीं है तो ऐसा लिखित रूप में दर्ज करते हुए इससे संबंधित परामर्श कुलपति को दे सकता है।
 9. अगर कुलपति को ऐसा ज्ञात होता है कि इसकी जाँच-पड़ताल की आवश्यकता नहीं है तो उनका निर्णय अंतिम माना जाएगा।
 10. धारा (5) या (6) के तहत रिपोर्ट की रसीद या धारा (7) के तहत संबद्ध विभाग द्वारा वर्णित घटनाओं में रैगिंग की घटना के खुलासे पर विचार और धारा 3 (a) और (c) में वाइस चांसलर छात्रा को एक वर्ष में नियम समय सीमा हेतु सीधा या आदेश द्वारा निष्कासित कर सकता है।
 11. रैगिंग के किसी भी मामले में कुलपति सीधे आदेश दे सकते हैं कि किसी छात्र या छात्रों को अध्ययन पाठ्यक्रम में प्रवेश दें या एक अवधि तक निष्कासित करें या न करें या कॉलेज, विभागीय परीक्षा के लिए एक या अधिक वर्षों तक या कि छात्र के परीक्षा परिणाम या परीक्षा में संबद्ध छात्र या परीक्षा जिसमें वह पास नहीं हुआ रद्द करें।
 12. यदि किसी मामले में जिस किसी भी छात्र ने दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय की डिग्री वापस लेने के बाद उचित कार्यवाही की जाएगी।
 13. इस अध्यादेश का उद्देश्य रैगिंग को उकसाने चाहे वह जिस भी तरीके से या कार्य या व्यवहार या रैगिंग को भड़काने हेतु हो उसका जुर्माना होगा।
 14. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में आने वाले सारे संस्थानों के लिए इस अध्यादेश के तहत दिए गए सभी निर्देश मान्य होंगे ताकि इस अध्यादेश को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के कुलपति प्रभावकारी तरीके से लागू कर सकें।

नोट : अध्यादेश XV-C के अनुसरण के लिए कुलपति के आदेश

रैगिंग से सम्बन्धित घटना (घटनाओं) की सूचना, अध्यादेश में शामिल अगर किसी भी प्राधिकारी की तरफ से कुलपति को दी जाती है तो रैगिंग में शामिल छात्र/छात्रा या छात्रों को निर्दिष्ट आदेशानुसार निष्कासित किया जाएगा। रैगिंग में शामिल गैर शामिल गैर छात्र (जो कॉलेज में नहीं पड़ते) के खिलाफ भारतीय क्रिमिनल लॉ के तहत कार्रवाई की जाएगी। ऐसे गैर छात्र/छात्राएं अगले पांच साल तक दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के किसी भी और न्याय का सख्त अनुपालन किया जाएगा।

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of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.

6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), and (c) the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way or any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instruction/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

NOTE: ORDER OF THE VICE-CHANCELLOR in pursuance of Ordinance XV- C

Where incident(s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority, the student(s) involved in ragging shall be expelled for a specified term, designated Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for a period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice in the order.

XV-D-Sexual Harassment

Some significant aspects of Delhi University's Ordinance XV-D: Sexual Harassment are as follows (For details, please check the college website: www.jdm.du.ac.in):

1. Short Title and Extent:

The present ordinance is based on the Policy against Sexual Harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academic and nonteaching staff of the Delhi University. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents, on the Delhi University campus, to the extent specified herein these rules and procedures. "Sexual harassment" includes any unwelcome sexually determined behaviour, whether directly or by implication and includes physical contact and advances, a demand or request for sexual favours, sexually-coloured remarks, showing pornography or any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature.

नियम और विनियम

वर्तमान अध्यादेश दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा यौन उत्पीड़न के खिलाफ की नीति पर आधारित है छात्रों और दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के शिक्षक और गैर शिक्षक कर्मचारियों के लिए यौन उत्पीड़न से मुक्त शैक्षिक और कार्य के वातावरण को बनाए रखने का प्रयास। यह अध्यादेश दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय परिसर में रह रहे निवासियों और बाहरी व्यक्तियों पर निर्दिष्ट किए हुए नियमों और प्रावधानों तक लागू होगा। यौन उत्पीड़न के तहत किसी भी प्रकार के अशोभनीय यौन निर्धारित व्यवहार, चाहे प्रत्यक्ष रूप से या निहितार्थ और जो शारीरिक संपर्क तथा उसके लिए आगे बढ़ने की चेष्टा को समेकित करता है, यौन-समर्थन के लिए निवेदन करना या कहना, यौन संबंधी टिप्पणी, अश्लील साहित्य दिखाना या अन्य किसी भी प्रकार का यौन संबंधी अशोभनीय शारीरिक, कथित या अकथित।

2. “यौन उत्पीड़न” में शामिल होगा लेकिन निम्नलिखित तक ही सीमित नहीं किया जाएगा:

- क. दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय में अवसरों या सेवाओं की पात्रता या रोजगार प्रदर्शन, अतिरिक्त पाठ्यक्रम कार्यक्रम कार्यकलाप से संबंधित किसी भी निर्णय के आधार पर जब प्रत्यक्ष या अप्रत्यक्ष रूप में एक अप्रिय यौन संबंध स्थापित करने हेतु प्रस्तुत, यौन समर्थन के लिए निवेदन, और कथित या यौन प्रकृति का शारीरिक आचरण किया जाता है।
- ख. अप्रिय यौन संबंध, कथित, अकथित और/या शारीरिक आचरण जैसे अप्रिय टिप्पणी, संकेत या मजाक, पत्र, फोन करना या ई मेल, शारीरिक बनावट, अश्लील साहित्य का प्रदर्शन, भयंकर रूप से घूरना, शारीरिक संपर्क, पीछा, अपमानजनक प्रदर्शन या आवाजें, का उद्देश्य और या प्रभाव जब किसी व्यक्ति विशेष के व्यवहार के साथ दखलंदाजी करना या शत्रुतापूर्ण, डरा हुआ या आक्रामक वातावरण तैयार करना हो।
- ग. जब कोई व्यक्ति यौन उद्देश्य से अपने शरीर के किसी हिस्से को या किसी वस्तु को जो शरीर का ही विस्तार लगे, का किसी दूसरे व्यक्ति के संबंध में बिना उसकी स्वीकृति के या उसकी इच्छा के खिलाफ प्रयोग करता है तो इस तरह के व्यवहार को यौन अत्याचार कहते हैं।
- घ. जब प्रतिकूल टिप्पणी, आचरण या ऐसा कोई भी व्यवहार जो किसी व्यक्ति के यौन उन्मुखीकरण या लैंगिक पहचान पर आधारित है और/या जब विश्वविद्यालय के सार्वजनिक मंच या कक्षा का प्रयोग किसी व्यक्ति को कलंकित करने/तिरस्कृत करने या किसी व्यक्ति के लैंगिक पहचान/यौन उन्मुखीकरण के आधार पर शत्रुतापूर्ण माहौल बनाने के लिए किया जाता है।

3. अध्यादेश के विषय-क्षेत्र/उद्देश्य: यह अध्यादेश सभी प्रकार की यौन उत्पीड़न की शिकायतों पर लागू होगा जो किया गया हो:

1. विश्वविद्यालय के किसी एक सदस्य द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के अन्य किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध चाहे वह परिसर के बाहर या अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
2. किसी निवासी द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध या विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध चाहे वह यौन उत्पीड़न परिसर के बाहर या अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
3. किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति द्वारा विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य के विरुद्ध या विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध अगर यौन उत्पीड़न परिसर के अंदर कथित रूप से किया गया है।
4. विश्वविद्यालय के किसी सदस्य द्वारा किसी बाहरी व्यक्ति के विरुद्ध अगर यौन उत्पीड़न परिसर के बाहर कथित रूप से किया गया हो ऐसी स्थिति में समिति सिफारिश करेगी कि विश्वविद्यालय का कॉलेज प्राधिकरण उचित प्राधिकारी से शिकायत कर जांच पड़ताल शुरू करे। इसके साथ ही समिति सक्रिय रूप से मदद करेगी और शिकायत को दर्ज करवाने में शिकायतकर्ता को उचित संसाधन मुहैया करवाएगी।

5. सुनवाई

दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के प्रत्येक कॉलेज में शिकायत और विवरण समिति के रूप में होगी।

1. कॉलेज शिकायत समिति प्रशासनिक पद/वर्ग से कथित शोषण करने वाले निष्कासित करने के लिए कह सकता है अगर उसकी उपस्थिति जांच-पड़ताल में बाधा उत्पन्न करती है।
2. यौन उत्पीड़न के शिकार व्यक्ति के पास यह विकल्प होगा कि वह या तो अपना तबादला दूसरी जगह करवाए या शोषण का तबादला दूसरी जगह करवाए।
3. सेवा शर्तों से संबंधित किसी भी अन्य अध्यादेश की सामग्री आदि के होते हुए भी संस्था के प्रधान से जांच रिपोर्ट प्राप्त होने

Rules and Regulations

2. Explanation. "Sexual harassment" shall include, but will not be confined to the following

- (a) When submission to unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours, and verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature are made, either implicitly or explicitly, a ground for any decision relating to employment, performance, extra-curricular activities, or entitlement to services or opportunities at the Delhi University.
- (b) When unwelcome sexual advances, and verbal, non-verbal and/or physical conduct such as loaded comments, remarks or jokes, letters, phone calls or e-mail, gestures, exhibition of pornography, lurid stares, physical contact, stalking, sounds or display of a derogatory nature have the purpose and/or effect of interfering with an individual's performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment.
- (c) When a person uses, with a sexual purpose, the body or any part of it or any object as an extension of the body in relation to another person without the latter's consent or against the person's will, such conduct will amount to sexual assault.
- (d) When deprecatory comments, conduct or any such behaviour is based on the gender identity /sexual orientation of the person and/or when the classroom or other public forum of the University is used to denigrate/discriminate against a person or create a hostile environment on the basis of a person's gender identity /sexual orientation.

3. Scope of the Ordinance:

This Ordinance shall be applicable to all complaints of sexual harassment made:

- (i) by a member of the University against any other member of the University irrespective of whether the harassment is alleged to have taken place within or outside the campus.
- (ii) by a resident against a member of the University or by a member against a resident irrespective of whether the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place within or outside the campus.
- (iii) by an outsider against a member of the University or by a member of the University against an outsider if the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place within the campus.
- (iv) by a member of the university, against an outsider if the sexual harassment is alleged to have taken place outside the campus. In such cases the Committee shall recommend that the University college authorities initiate action by making a complaint with the appropriate authority. Further the committee will actively assist and provide available resources to the complainant in pursuing the complaint.

4. Complaint Mechanism:

- (i) College Complaints Committees, which shall be set up in each college of the University of Delhi as complaints and redressal bodies.

5. Redressal:

- (i) CCC may ask the College to suspend the alleged harasser from an administrative post/class if his/her presence is likely to interfere with the enquiry.
- (ii) The victim of sexual harassment shall have the option to seek transfer of the perpetrator or her/his own transfer where applicable.
- (iii) Notwithstanding the contents of any other ordinance relating to service conditions etc., the head of the institution upon receipt of the enquiry report, shall refer the same to the Governing Body/Executive Council (EC) and take disciplinary action on the basis of recommendations of the Complaint Committees provided that in the case of termination of service the existing rules of the University will also be forwarded.
- (iv) The disciplinary action shall be commensurate with the nature of the violation.

1. चेतावनी 2. लिखित माफीनामा 3. अच्छे व्यवहार का अनुबंधन 4. आश्वस्त रिपोर्ट में प्रतिकूल टिप्पणी 5. पर्यवेक्षक कर्तव्यों से निष्कासन 6. कानूनी निकायों की सदस्यता से मनाही 7. पुनः रोजगार से मनाही 8. पदोन्नति और वेतन वृद्धि में रोक 9. पूर्व स्थिति, पदावनति 10. निलंबन 11. पदच्युति 12. कोई अन्य प्रासंगिक व्यवस्था

ख. छात्रों के मामलों में अनुशासनात्मक कार्यवाही निम्न रूप में हो सकती है :

1. चेतावनी 2. लिखित माफीनामा 3. अच्छे व्यवहार का अनुबंधन 4. छात्रावास या परिसर में प्रवेश से निष्कासन 5. एक निर्दिष्ट अवधि के लिए निलंबन 6. परिणाम रोकना 7. परीक्षा से निष्कासन 8. चुनाव लड़ने से निष्कासन 9. पद ग्रहण करने से निष्कासन 10. निष्कासन 11. प्रवेश में रोक 12. एक निर्धारित समयावधि के लिए अवांछित व्यक्ति के रूप में उत्पीड़क की घोषणा 13. कोई अन्य प्रासंगिक व्यवस्था

ग. तीसरे पक्ष द्वारा उत्पीड़न के मामले में विश्वविद्यालय/कॉलेज प्राधिकरण उचित प्राधिकरण से शिकायत करके उचित कार्यवाही शुरू करेगा।

RIGHT TO INFORMATION

According to Government of India, Right to Information (RTI) is

- (i) An Act to provide for setting out the practical regime of right to information for citizens to secure access to information under the control of public authorities, in order to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority, the constitution of a Central Information Commission and State Information Commissions and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.
- (ii) WHEREAS the Constitution of India has established democratic Republic;
- (iii) AND WHEREAS democracy requires an informed citizenry and transparency of information which are vital to its functioning and also to contain corruption and to hold Governments and their instrumentalities accountable to the governed;
- (iv) AND WHEREAS revelation of information in actual practice is likely to conflict with other public interests including efficient operations of the Governments, optimum use of limited fiscal resources and the preservation of confidentiality of sensitive information;
- (v) AND WHEREAS it is necessary to harmonise these conflicting interests while preserving the paramountcy of the democratic ideal;
- (vi) According to the university, the first appellate authority of the college is the Principal, who is responsible for all matters pertaining to RTI in this institution.
- (vii) BE it enacted by Parliament in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Republic of India.



Seminars/Workshops/Talks Organised in 2019-20

Department of Commerce organised a seminar in collaboration with Securities Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on 'Financial Literacy and Awareness'. The speakers, Ms. Veena Kumari, Manager SEBI OIAE and Ms. Gurvinder Kaur, SEBI officer, addressed the audience on various roles of SEBI to safeguard the interests of investors and market regulations.

An inter-college annual cultural festival 'Com-Talk 2019' was organised on the theme of 'Myriad of Colors', with a series of events such as Fashion show, 'Doodle-Woogle', 'Commerce Roadies', etc.





मुगल आर्किटेक्चर विभिन्न क्षेत्रों का मिश्रण है : प्रो. रेजावी


