OBSERVATIONS:


From the given responses, it can be summarised that a high percentage of students (69.6%) strongly agreed on the significance of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, with an additional 28.3 % agreeing. Further, a large percentage of students (60.9%) strongly agreed that the course instilled in them a sense of service towards society and the Nation, while 34.8 % agreed. This indicated widespread agreement on the importance of the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. In addition, half of the students (50%) strongly agreed that the course enabled them understand the developmental challenges related to sanitation infrastructure and practices, while 43.5 % agreed and 6.5 % students remained neutral. Similarly, 63% of students strongly agreed that the course helped them build values of cleanliness, hygiene and waste management, with 34.8 % agreeing and 2.2% remaining neutral. The findings suggest a strong consensus among students on the positive impact of the Swachh Bharat course, highlighting its significance in raising awareness and having support for the initiative. In terms of attendance observations, 60.9% students had above 67% attendance, while 34.8 % had their attendance between 50-67% and 4.3 % had less than 50% attendance.

ACTION TO BE TAKEN:

The teaching-learning process can be enhanced by adding practical experiences, like organising awareness campaigns and conducting cleanliness drives, to further promote the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan and its significance among students. Activities like identifying plastic and e-waste in their surroundings can also be conducted for their better understanding of waste management and environmental conservation. Observations:

Course Specific Outcomes:





Observations/Learning Outcome:

The students were mostly regular for the classes and around 63 percent students scored more than 67 percent attendance. The lectures provided better understanding and exposure of various aspects of India's Foreign Policy in a Globalising World to students in terms of both ability to understand the works and studies related to India's Foreign Policy and the ability to understand key aspects of India's ability to engage with powerful nations of the world like US, Russia and China. The average performance of the students was found ranging good to excellent in terms of Internal Assessments. Most of the students agreed that the course is very relevant and has generated interests to pursue further related papers in Political Science. The students learnt the ability to understand about India's negotiation strategy in dealing with global trade, environment and security regime in general. For this, debates or simulations were organised where students did role-play as Indian policymakers and advocated for different foreign policy approaches.

Way forward/Action to be taken:

Observation

The B.A. Program (Minor) course titled "Indian Government and Politics" imparts knowledge about features of Indian Constitution, it's various provisions, institutions and working. The students responded that they found this course very interesting and informative. They also found the pedagogy to be quite effective. Close to 99 percent students were able to understand Indian Constitution and its basic features. The course also provided 98 percent students with the ability to understand their rights and duties as citizens and the constitutional obligation of the State. The course also equipped 95 percent students with the understanding and knowledge about party system and political parties in India. Attendance of the students can be earmarked as an area for improvement as 68 percent students attended more than 67 percent attendance in the given course, while 27.5 percent students had attendance between 50 and 67 percent. More than 4 percent students had less than 50 percent attendance. The students overall gave positive feedback on the course and pedagogy, however, feedback for improvement included shortening the length of syllabus and increasing the number of lectures.

Action Taken Report

The length of syllabus and increase the number of classes remain out of the scope of concerned teacher as it is a University prescribed syllabus. However, representation with above mentioned suggestions will be conveyed to the university through proper channel. To facilitate those who did not give favorable response, in addition to more inclusive pedagogy with real life examples, the attempt will be made to ensure that the attendance of the students improve. To achieve higher attendance of students in class, measures such as one on one contact with the students to encourage them to attend the lectures; and to make the subject even more interesting and engaging to the students will be taken.


From the given responses, it can be summarised that more than half of the students (55.4%) strongly agreed that they gained in-depth understanding of nature and scope of comparative politics, with an additional 42.9% agreeing. Similarly, 57.1% of students strongly agreed that the course provided them with the knowledge of electoral systems and party systems across countries, while 39.3% agreed and 3.6 % remained neutral. 


Do you appreciate and value the distinctiveness of Comparative Political Theory? 23 responses


ACTION TO BE TAKEN REPORT:


Did the course improve your understanding about the concept of Rule of law and Criminal justice system in India?




Was the course useful in understanding the debates surrounding Equality and Non-discrimination and the related legislations



Attendance 30.8% students had more than 67% attendance,50% students had their attendance ranging between 50 to 67% while 19.2% had less than 50% attendance




Q2) Do you think it is easy to follow Gandhi's ideas in daily routine life? ^{29 responses}




Q3) Do you agree with Gandhi's views on modern civilization which he has written in Hind Swaraj? ^{29 responses}
