Janki Devi Memorial College Library is equipped to meet essential academic and intellectual needs of its students. A state of the art library with Open access system, Online Public Access Catalogue and spacious reading rooms provide an atmosphere conducive to study. It has provision of more than 250 seats for users to be seated in Library reading hall.

The Library maintains separate air-conditioned room with 24 laptops for Faculty Reading and Research purpose and an E-resource Centre with 43 laptops for students.

The College Library began with an initial number of 200 books in March 1960 it had 1352 books and presently we have more than a lakh books. Collection is continuously updated with changes in curriculum. It subscribes to 14 newspaper titles with few multiple copies and 68 National/International journals/magazines

Library is connected to Delhi University network with access to DULS databases and e-resources. Library subscribes to N-LIST (a programme of INFLIBNET) to provide remote access to users to huge number of e- resource. Library is Wi-Fi enabled for internet connectivity. Many CD's and DVD's are also available in library collection.



Library Working Hours

- Saturday for reading and consultation only.
- Sunday opens during examination days for reading and consultation.
- Circulation services are available from 9:30 AM to 4:30 PM (Monday to Friday)

Library Membership

- ➤ All members are issued college ID cum Library Card membership card from Library.
- ➤ Membership card issued to the member is property of the College and the members are required to surrender the same to the library at the time of leaving the college or conclusion of the programme.
- ➤ Members must carry her membership smart card on every visit to the library and produce it whenever demanded by the library staff.
- Member should keep his/her membership smart card. He/She is liable for any use/misuse of his/her card by others. In the event of loss or theft.

Loan Facility

Only registered members are entitled to borrow books from the library. The following table provides borrowing privileges for various categories of members and collection.

- A member shall be required to produce membership card to borrow books.
- ➤ Books from book bank can be borrowed only on specific days announced by the library.

Library Resources

➤ General collection: - Includes books, text books, Braille books and bound volumes of journals. Books are organized in open access shelves in various collections.

- ➤ Reference Collection: Reference/Not for issue section books can only be consulted within the library. Subject to copy right regulation this material can be photocopied. Photocopy service is available in the library, there is photocopy shop in the campus can also be used.
- ➤ Journals and Magazines: -Sixtyeight National and International Journals/magazines are subscribed by the library. Eleven Daily newspapers (English and Hindi).
- ➤ Questions Papers: Questions papers of past years are available at the Circulation counter for reference.
- Laptops for students and teachers to access e-resources. Separate OPAC terminals to access library catalogue.
 - ➤ Kindles -2, Digital Board and LCD- Projector and sound system. Use Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to locate the books.

Assistance provided to Students with Disabilities in the College Library

We at JDMC strive to provide equal opportunity to all students in learning. To provide them equal access, the library has installed screen reading software NVDA (Non Visual Desktop Access) in five desktop systems in an exclusive room in the library and plextalks angel pocket recorders are issued to visually challenged users. We also arrange Braille books and talking books, Brailler and DAISY Books. Computer training is also provided to our visually challenged students/teachers. A separate Room is maintained in the library with five desktop computers with internet and screen reading s/w NVDA and two Scanners to avoid hurdles in teaching and learning of our special students. Personal assistance is given to such students.

The e-resource centre in the library is also disabled friendly and adapts inclusivity as five laptops have latest version of INDO NVDA.




