Srinivas and T.N. Madan, Dr. Yadav shared her research experience, notably her study on Astrology in India, which is published under her name.

The seminar concluded with an interactive Q&A session, allowing students to engage with Dr. Yadav and deepen their understanding of ethnographic research. Overall, the department facilitated a highly informative session, providing valuable insights for the students' future endeavours.

She pointed out how the data helps us recognize that harassment occurs in both the public and private sphere. Cases of harassment that occurs in the public are observed, recognized, and reported, whereas cases in the private sphere are not even questioned. She also delves in to discuss on marital rape as a point to discuss the issue of consent, and dimensions that marginalizes women and limit their independence.

Webinars like this leave a great impact on people to think about and it is no doubt that we anticipate more of such gender conscious workshops in future.



A Dream of Trees

The Sociology Department of Janki Devi Memorial College organized a movie screening of "A Dream of Trees" on September 26th at 09:30 am in the seminar hall. The film explores the relationship between humans and trees, focusing on the ecological restoration of tropical rainforests in India's Anamalai Hills. It follows the work of Nature Conservation Foundation scientists, highlighting the importance of civet excreta in forest growth and the role of restoration in reintroducing wildlife.

Following the screening, an interactive discussion led by Charu Ma'am and Vandana Ma'am emphasized the significance of local involvement in ecological restoration. The Principal, Professor Swati Pal, shared a poignant story illustrating the importance of love and respect for nature. The film left a profound lesson on the irreversible impact of destruction and the challenges of restoration.

The resource person for the workshop was Ms. Ishita Debnath Biswas, Visual Artist and Designer and department alumna. Ms. Biswas introduce the theme and emphasized on the significant distinctions between a narrative and a story, as well as how a single story may be told using a variety of narratives. Her expertise in the field of visual storytelling and design gave the viewers a new perspective on how to view an image. She not only imparted knowledge on the fundamental principles but also on the concept behind the visual illustrations found in children's books, highlighting the fact that complex stories are often simplified for a child's benefit and are often depicted in fantastical and abstract ways in addition to realistic ones. Ms. Biswas' leadership allowed the workshop to successfully educate the excited students a new paradigm for comprehending the view all around them.

The Sociology Department organised a film screening for third-year students on September 19, 2023, to help them understand the relationship between humans and the environment. The chosen movie for the same was Bill Kroyer's 1992 animated environmental fantasy film *Fern Gully: The Last Rainforest*. The screening took place in Room 43A from 10 A.M. to 11 A.M. The movie explored themes of environmental conservation, the impact of human activity on nature, and the magic of the rainforest. It was an hour-long film that was animated beautifully and kept the audience engaged throughout.




Orientation Programme for the First Year Students
