1. The minutes of the previous meeting dated 29<sup>th</sup> August 2022 were passed.

# 2. Compliance Report/ Action Taken Report by the IQAC

The Coordinator put forth the actions taken pertaining to the discussions in the previous IQAC meeting:

Issue	Action Taken
Low registrations and high dropout rate in few value-added courses	Student survey was conducted and the list of add-on courses preferred by students was shared with faculty members. Faculty has been advised to offer courses that are listed as desired by students. In addition, students' mentoring is also being done by departments as well as by the Principal that includes guiding students to use the opportunity and enroll for the courses and to complete the courses they opt for.  The mentoring sessions by IQAC members will soon be initiated.
Increasing the number of publications in UGC-CARE List / Scopus indexed journals	Faculty is being advised and encouraged to  a. publish in UGC-CARE/ Scopus Indexed journals and  b. to register on various research portals especially INFLIBNET/Vidwan to increase the academic and research visibility of the college.  The IQAC held workshops to facilitate faculty members to do so.
To improve 'Perception' towards the college/ engage in Brand building	Initiatives taken in this regard include:  a. Collecting testimonials from by Students, Parents, Alumni and Employers and displaying them up on the college website. The Coordinator thanked the Website committee for this initiative.
	b. Media and Publicity Committee has been asked to be more pro-active and use social media as well as print media platforms to improve public perception towards the college.

# 3. Reporting Matters by the Principal

- Monday morning meetings have been initiated for the non-teaching staff as a best practice.
- The college will soon be applying for MCD permission for a new Academic Block.
- The process of reconstruction, repairs and renovation in the college is ongoing.
- In the coming years, the focus will be on consolidation such as phasing out of laptops and computers, adding Smart Classrooms, improving the furniture etc.
- The college is receiving recognition by the University and has been designated as the Cluster College for the implementation of NEP. JDMC is the Coordinating/Hub college for VAC, SEC and AEC courses.
- The Principal appreciated Dr. J. Gill, Convenor, Fee Assistance Committee for providing financial assistance to needy students.
- As a part of DU Centenary celebrations, the college is organizing Alumni Panel Discussion Series by all departments. The papers by hundred Alumni will be published in the form of a book.
- The College is planning Alumni Meet in the month of Jan/Feb 2023.
- The Principal will propose, in the Staff Council Meeting, to reduce the teaching load of the IQAC Coordinator to half and the remaining time to be spent in the college in IQAC-related work.

## 4. Reporting Matters by the Coordinator

- The SSR (Self Study Report) was successfully submitted to NAAC on 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022. The Annual Quality Assurance Report, AQAR 2021-22 was successfully submitted on 9<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The Coordinator thanked the SSR Team for all the effort put in each member and the entire teaching and non-teaching staff for their cooperation.
- We are preparing data for submission for National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF)-2023.
- The college is preparing for ISO 21001:2018 certification. A Two-Day Internal Auditor Course ISO 21001:2018 –EOMS (Management Systems for Educational Organizations) was conducted on 14-15 December 2022. Twenty staff members (15 teachers and 5 non-teaching staff) are now certified ISO 21001:2018 Internal Auditors.
- Collaborations under Vidya Vistar Scheme- In addition to the collaboration with Mahatma Gandhi Govt College, University of Pondicherry, Andaman initiated in 2021-22, the college will soon sign the formal MOU with *Devnar Foundation For The Blind*, *Secunderabad*, *Telangana*. The proposal has been approved by the University. The Coordinator thanked Dr Zubeer Ahmad for initiating this collaboration.
- In the village adopted in Poshangipur Gaon, Janak Puri in May 2022, Centre for Extension and Outreach has conducted Baseline survey and few activities such as visit to their Anganwadis, celebration of Children's Day, Diwali celebration in Anganwadis and need assessment survey.
- A call has been given to parents of all students to be a part of IQAC.
- The Mentor-Mentee list will soon be finalized for first years

- As per the IQAC Checklist provided, departments conduct workshops related to Soft Skills, Career Counselling, IPRs, Research Methodology, Gender Equity Promotion, Values and ethics, Celebration of national and international commemorative days, events and festivals, Add-on Courses, FDPs, ICT etc.
- Mid-session IQAC Review is in process, taking stock of work done so far by various departments and take timely action/intervention.

- 3. Faculty members are being encouraged to create E-resources using Smart board/ Recording Room.
- 4. "Mentoring Sessions: An Interaction with Prof. Swati Pal, Principal, JDMC"- four sessions were conducted for first year students and parents on 6th, 7<sup>th</sup>, 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> Dec 2022.
- 5. A two-day Internal Auditor Course ISO 21001:2018 –EOMS (Management Systems for Educational Organizations) was conducted on 14-15 December 2022 by Centre of Assessments for Excellence (COAE) An ISO 17021 Accredited Educational Certification Body.

### **Discussion**

1. The Coordinator shared the *Status Report* for the *Strategic Plan 2017-22*. The college has achieved several milestones in terms of improving infrastructure, strengthening of research ecosystem, enhancing students' skills, setting up incubation programme, initiating E-journal and college publications, strengthening feedback mechanisms, expanding our collaborations, adopting of a village, increasing use of ERP modules and getting recognition for our green practices.

- Increasing the visibility of the college by publishing podcasts by students and faculty on social media, recording testimonials during Symphony, increasing presence of JDMC on Instagram & cross-linking of Instagram accounts of various societies, departments and Students Union.
