

with an animal who shares her mysteries of her world. The screening was attended by around 15 participants.





Nature Photography Workshop

On 19 April 2022, an online workshop on Nature Photography was held by Avani to celebrate the Environment Festival, EKATVAM 2022. The speaker for the session was Mr Arun Puri, a mechanical engineer by profession. For more than 20 years, he has been passionately in the creative field and has learned and loved the journey. He was awarded Bharat ke rung medal in 2017, Awarded 800+ times at Facebook groups, won photography competition organised by Ministry of Art and Culture under the theme "Jan Jan Mein Vigyan" in 2022.

Mr Arun puri started the session by introducing the Basics of photography. What are the important options and angles we have to keep in our mind while clicking any photograph? Types of cameras,

basics of taking photography through different types of cameras. He also taught the basics of editing. Further, he gave a brief description about how DSLR cameras works. In his lecture he also shed light on the important factors which affect picture quality, that is light source, quality of light, shutter speed, composition, resolution, focus, perspective and skill and editing. Understanding 'grid line' is an important as it provides perspective like how to place grid lines according to the view and what are the techniques for good photographs while using grid lines. He also showed some image compositions related to blurred background photography, ground level shots and guideline shots.



successfully completed a 30 hour online Add-on Course, Striking a Balance: Environment and Society offered by Avani, the Environment Club.








Avani Collects for Goonj March, 2022



Virtual Tour of Yamuna Biodiversity Park






Virtual Tour of Yamuna Biodiversity Park- October 6, 2021
