In the academic year 2018-19, GSC (JDMC) undertook the following activities:

## **Mentorship:**

• GSC-JDMC inaugurated a new mentorship programme with the GLOW (Growing Leadership of Women) Foundation for mentoring bright underprivileged students. This programme is providing mentorship to seven girls. Each girl is assigned a mentor to inculcate the leadership ability in her. Mentors are highly successful women professionals from the corporate and social service sector who work on areas of gender equality and education of underprivileged girls willing to give their time for social well-being. The programme envisages monthly meetings between mentor and mentee as well as leadership development workshops (First meeting was held on January 28th, 2019 and second meeting is scheduled on March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019).
