Brief Report

On 22nd and 23rd September, 2025, Janki Devi Memorial College, in collaboration with Travelling Film South Asia and *Lumière: The Film and Photography Club*, hosted a vibrant two day international film festival that placed South Asian narratives at its heart.

The seminar began with a welcome address by **Prof. Swati Pal, Principal of JDMC**, who extended greetings to the filmmakers and emphasized the importance of cinema as a medium of cultural dialogue and creative expression. A thought provoking panel discussion chaired by Mr. Shivam Sharma, the convener of Lumiere, followed, featuring filmmaker **Mr. Prateek Shekhar** and Film South Asia's director **Ms. Meetu Verma**, who shared their experiences and inspiring stories.


Audiences were treated to the screening of four acclaimed films- *Aakash Ganga*, *A Forgotten Summer*, *I Found My Yellow, and Love Like Ours*. The screening drew enthusiastic participation from students, faculty and film lovers making the first day a resounding success. Six diverse films were showcased: *Go Home Gota*, *When Pomegranate Turns Grey*, *A Flaming Forest*, *Whispers by River Shore*, *Sometimes Even the Shore Drowns*, and *Hello Guys*. Each film offered a distinctive perspective-ranging from profound social narratives to poetic reflections on nature and human emotions.

Audiences were captivated by the powerful visuals, thoughtful themes, and depth of storytelling. The screenings not only highlighted emerging filmmakers but also provided a platform for meaningful conversations on culture, identity, and contemporary issues. Each

film was followed by an insightful discussion of the audience with the director. Students from colleges and universities across the city had come as audience.

Across both days, the festival emerged as a lively celebration of creativity and cinematic excellence. It inspired students and film enthusiasts alike, reaffirming JDMC's commitment to fostering dialogue through art and storytelling.






