
World Bee Day Celebration






WORLD ENVIRONMENT DAY 2023 5 June 2023 Under the G20 Janbhagidari Aazadi ka Amrit Mahotsay

The Student's Union of Janki Devi Memorial College in collaboration with Avani-The Environment Club undertook some activities in observance of World Environment Day on 5th June, 2023. The event commenced with the tree plantation drive where we planted the Tecoma stans plant, Lantanas and two figs (anjeer) plants as herbal plants. The aim was to promote the significance of reforestation and bring about a sense of restoration of degraded landscapes.

The students of the environment club made bird feeders and nests out of waste products. Coconut shells, cardboard, plastic bottles and plates were used in a creative way to make the feeders and nests. This activity inculcated the idea of waste management and bird conservation.

Harvested beetroots, okra, spinach, Barbati beans, parsley and celery were plucked from the garden beside krishna hostel. Furthermore, it was learnt how kitchen gardening is an excellent way to have access to fresh and organic food which involves growing vegetables, fruits and herbs on a small piece of land in a planned way to meet the daily food requirements and ensures the reduction of our carbon footprint.

Guest, Mr. Deepak Saini who is a yoga teacher at The Shri Ram School, Vasant Vihar graced the occasion with his benign presence. He was felicitated by the Principal. Our Principal, Prof. Swati Pal addressed the gathering with the introduction and benefits of yoga.

Mr. Saini talked about the importance of maintaining a balance between the mind, body and the soul. He then practiced some yoga-asanas with the students. The session commenced with a guided tour of the college website, covering essential sections such as the homepage, information centers, e-journal perspective, principal's message, student welfare processes, accreditation details, grievance committee and its mechanisms by Sarvashi Ajmani

Thereafter, Ira Chaturvedi delivered an informative overview of the college's founding principles, its focus on empowering marginalized women, accreditations, environmental initiatives (such as rainwater harvesting, solar energy systems, waste management), and its numerous accolades and awards.

A detailed checklist of the college facilities was presented, encompassing classrooms, administrative blocks, various department rooms, hostel accommodation, recreational spaces, sports amenities, green initiatives, disability-friendly utilities, library facilities, and multiple societal and club offerings.

Indo Argentina Relations: The Road Ahead


20 November, 2023
